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## Refuse Fees Cut

The Village Board has reduced the monthly garbage rates from \$16.00 to \$14.50 for once per week collection, and from \$22.50 to \$20.50 for twice per week collection. The new rates are effective January 1, 1991. The rate reduction will save Glenview residents approximately \$200,000 over a twelve month period.

The rate reduction is attributed to the recycling and yard waste programs. With the implementation of those programs, the regular refuse stream has been reduced and less waste is being deposited in landfills. The waste that is removed from the waste stream today has translated into the refuse fee reduction. This is

a direct economic benefit of the recycling program.

Perhaps more important is the "cost avoidance factor". Saving space in landfills will extend their lives. As landfill space dwindles, and supply and demand concepts are vividly defined, dumping costs will increase exponentially. Glenview residents who participate in the recycling program help "prolong" these increases, and are responsible for the refuse fee reduction.

If you recycle, thank you for your efforts. If you don't, please do. Remember, "once is never enough".

## 1991 Senior Housing Assistance Program Funds Available

The Glenview Village Board has increased funding for the 1991 Senior Housing Assistance Program. Funds are available for 20 eligible Glenview residents. The annual amount of the payments is \$1,000, compared to \$840 in 1990.

Eligibility is based on a first qualified, first served basis. Requirements are as follows:

- Recipients must have been a Glenview resident (living within the corporate limits of the Village) for at least two years.
- Recipients must be 62 years of age or older.
- If you live alone, your total yearly income in 1990 cannot exceed \$10,000. If two persons live in your home, the combined income cannot exceed \$12,000.

-- Residents of the Patten House are not eligible.

Applications for the Village of Glenview Housing Assistance Program are available at the Village Hall, Glenview Public Library, and Glenview Senior Center (Rugen Community Center). Applications will be accepted beginning February 1, 1991. Any received prior to that date will be returned. Review of applications will be made after February 1, 1991, and will continue through the year until the appropriation is expended. Since applications will be approved on a first qualified, first served basis, individuals are urged to submit completed applications promptly. They will be held in strictest confidence.

## Christmas Tree Recycling Program Continued

The Village of Glenview and the Glenview Park District will be collecting Christmas Trees for recycling again this Holiday Season. Starting Wednesday, January 2, 1991, and continuing through Friday, January 11, 1991, residents may place Christmas trees on the parkway for recycling. All decorations, nails, and tree stands must be removed from the tree as they will damage the shredding equipment. One final collection of all Village streets will begin Monday, January 14th at 7 A.M., weather permitting.

Any trees placed outside after our final pickup will have to be disposed of by your regular refuse hauler, *at no additional cost*. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency considers Christ-

mas Trees as "household waste" and can be disposed of in landfills. We would rather that the trees be recycled, and encourage you to participate in the program.

This year multifamily buildings will be included in the program. Village staff will be contacting the Townhome and Condo Associations to establish centralized collection points for each property development.

## WARNING! BEWARE OF UNAUTHORIZED TELEPHONE SOLICITORS

The Village Glenview has received numerous telephone calls from irate Glenview citizens complaining that the Glenview Fire Department is soliciting for contributions. This article is to set the record straight that neither the Village, nor its Fire Department, requests or solicits contributions from its citizens.

There is an organization with offices located in Glenview known as the North Suburban Professional Firefighters Association which is telephoning Glenview citizens and requesting contributions. That association is not affiliated with the Village of Glenview or its Fire Department, and has not and will not be authorized by the Village to solicit funds from Glenview citizens. Furthermore, no Glenview Firefighter is a member of this organization.

The Village has been advised that solicitors representing the North Suburban Professional Firefighters Association have, either directly or by implication, led Glenview citizens to believe that their contributions would be used on behalf of the Glenview Fire Department and its Firefighters. This is simply not the case and is untrue.

The Village has requested that the Attorney General's office of Illinois investigate the actions of the North Suburban Professional Firefighters Association. ## Property Tax Deferral

Senior Illinois residents who are

homeowners and whose annual income is less than \$14,000 can apply to have the state pay part or all of their property taxes. When the individual sells the house, moves or dies, the person's estate will be obliged to repay the state the amount that is expended plus six percent interest. ## Parking Privileges for Persons with Disabilities

Any motor vehicle transporting a person who is disabled and displaying handicapped license plates, disabled veteran plates or a handicapped parking card may use parking areas designated for use by persons with disabilities. The Secretary of State's Office issues handicapped license plates and parking cards. Persons with permanent disabilities are issued a four year parking card. Temporary cards are issued to persons who have disabilities of 12 months or longer. ## Social Security and Medicare Changes

In January, 1991, recipients of Social Security or S.S.I. will receive a cost of living raise of 5.4%. Medi-

care premiums are scheduled to increase to \$29.90 per month and the Part B deductible for Medicare beneficiaries will increase from \$75 to \$100 (Source: Keenager News, 12/90 issue).

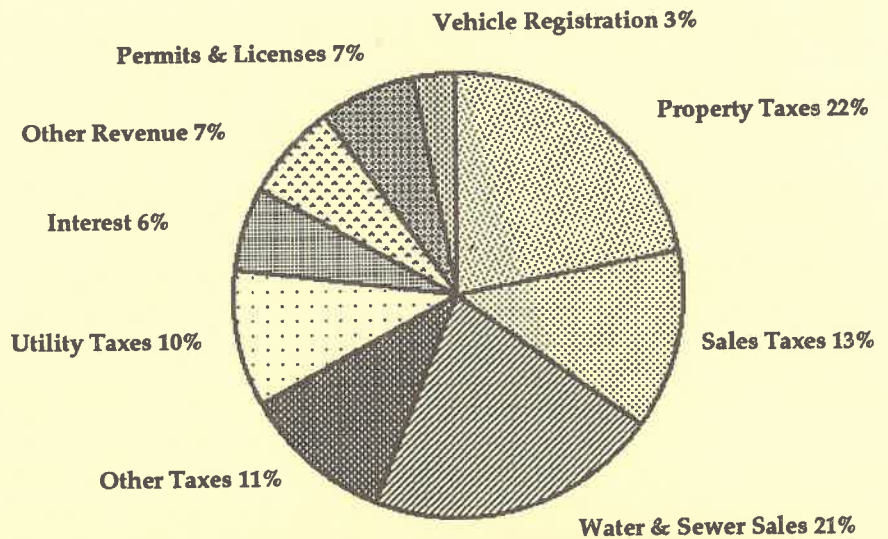

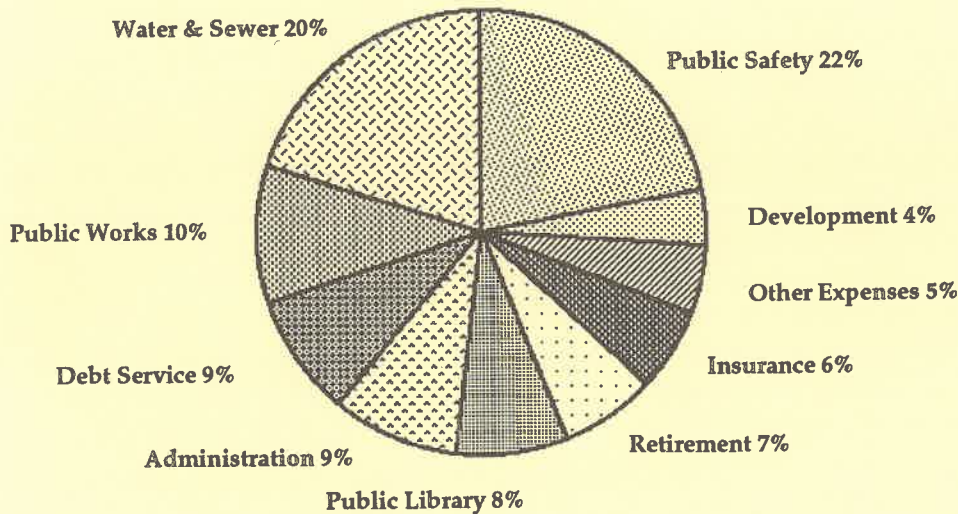

### Village Board Highlights

Village Board meetings are held the first and third Tuesdays of each month, in the Village Hall, at 7:30 P.M.. Residents are welcome at the meetings. Those wanting to speak on agenda items may fill out cards at the door and hand them to the secretary; those wanting to speak on nonagenda items must make advance arrangements with the Manager's Office.

The first Village Board meeting in 1991 will be held *Wednesday, January 2, 1991*.

APPROVED the 1991 budget (see above).

REDUCED residential refuse rates (see article on page 1).

APPROVED a 1990 tax rate of .5546 per \$100 equalized assessed value for all Village funds. The net dollar amount levied, excluding the Library, is \$3,882,223. This net figure includes all abatements routinely extended.

APPROVED the annexation agreement with Signode regarding development of some of the property at the northeast

corner of Pfingsten Rd. and Lake St.

AWARDED bid for water pump monitoring system in the amount of \$417,000 to J. Schonthal and Associates, Evanston. This system will allow constant, computerized analysis of the Village's water system in an effort to save utility costs, isolate system problems, and maintain appropriate system pressure.
