## Marine Unit Displays Glenview Ties

Marine Major "Hal" Walker, Commander of the HML 776 Marine Helicopter Group accepted a Village of Glenview flag from Steve Halls, Deputy Chief of the Glenview Police Department. The flag was presented during a brief ceremony held on February 1, 1991. In return, the Marine Group presented the Glenview Police Department with a replica of the Marine Unit's insignia and requested that it be kept in a safe place until their return from active duty. The Glenview officers and the Marines got to know each other during the first part of February when the Marine Unit was using portions of the Glenview Police Administration Building for some last minute training.

This Activated Reserve Unit, presently stationed at the Glenview Naval Air Station, is composed of approximately 130 personnel and 6 helicopters. The unit was scheduled to report to "West Pac" staging area in either Okinawa or the Philippines, and then reportedly transferred to the Persian Gulf.

While accepting this flag, Major Walker assured everyone that the flag would fly on the Unit's standard, no matter where they were. Additionally, a photograph of the flag and surroundings would be taken at each new location, to provide our department with a log of the flag's travels.

"This is our way of sending a part of us and our community with these young men, wherever they are. We want them to remember that there are many of us back home, in addition to their families, who are aware of their sacrifices and who will worry about them until they are safely home", said Deputy Chief Halls.

The Unit's nickname is the "Gangsters"; their insignia is a gangster with his tommy gun. This nickname was chosen because of the unit's proximity to Chicago, and because of the machine guns carried by its helicopters. These "Hueys" carry a gatling gun, .50 cal. and .60 cal. machine guns, and the 7.62 "Mighty Mouse" rockets.

The Village of Glenview would like to express sincere appreciation to the men and women serving in the American Armed Forces (and their families as well), and hopes for a safe and speedy return of those forces serving in the Middle East.

## Fire District Merger Pursued by Village

In order to eliminate the double taxation that was explained in a recent special edition of The Village Report, three courses of action are being pursued.

The first course of action is the annexation of the forest preserve property that was annexed by the Glenbrook Fire Protection District in the 1970s. If the Village annexes that same property, the statutory merger process is initiated. If the Village were to annex that property, the district would be forced to merge with the Village.

The second course of action is being pursued predominately by a large group of doubly-taxed residents. The residents have asked the court to allow a referendum to be placed on the ballot to dissolve the district. If the district were to dissolve, then the Village would assume its

responsibilities, equipment, etc. Furthermore, the Village Board has publicly stated their desire to assume the District's personnel as well.

The third course of action is negotiation between the Village Board and the Fire District Trustees. These efforts have not proven effective as of this date, however the Glenview Village Board has indicated a willingness to conduct public meetings to discuss the issues.

**Under no circumstances will the quality of fire services be diminished for residents of either the Village or the district as a result of a merger between the two departments!** Please call 724-1700, ext. 242, or 201 if you have questions regarding the possible merger.

**APPROVED** contract with DiMeo Bros., Inc., Park Ridge in an amount not to exceed \$150,887 to install a water main along Milwaukee Ave., from north of Lake Street to the Cook County Forest Preserve, through the Preserve to an existing main in Winkelman Road.

**AUTHORIZED** purchase of four replacement unmarked police cars and replacement police mobile radios. The Motorola price was \$29,172 for 20 radios. The unmarked vehicles will be used by the detective bureau, and not individually cost more than \$11,000.

#### Village Board Highlights

**ANNEXED AND REZONED** the Marriott property located on Landwehr Rd., just west of the Glenbrook Hospital, to construct a congregate care/senior housing facility. This is a joint project between the Evanston Hospital Corporation and the Marriott Corporation to provide senior rental and assisted living property.

**ADOPTED** an ordinance that states that the Village is ready and willing to assume the fire protection duties, physical assets, and equipment of the Glenbrook Fire Protection District, should the district be resolved. This ordinance is a legal requirement that stipulates a continuance of service for any property that lies within the current boundaries of the district (see article above).
