Street Maintenance and Repair Schedule Announced

The Village develops a five year capital improvement plan to identify the infrastructure needs of the community. With regard to street repairs, the Village retains a consultant to conduct a comprehensive analysis of each street. This analysis takes into consideration the base of the street, or, what is underneath the surface, as well as the surface condition of the street. Depending on the funds that are available, the streets to be reconstructed or resurfaced are identified.

The Village will be awarding a contract for the resurfacing of various municipal streets. However, the maintenance shall consist of replacing deteriorated curb, gutter, sidewalk, adjustment of structures in the street, removing the existing asphalt and resurfacing the following streets:

Glenview Named Tree City USA



TREE CITY USA

Glenview has been named a Tree City USA by the National Arbor Day Foundation for the sixth consecutive year. To become a Tree City USA, a community must meet four standards: the community must have a tree board or department, a city tree ordinance, a comprehensive community forestry program, and an Arbor Day observance. "An effective community forestry program is an ongoing process of renewal and improvement -- a program of tree planting and care that continues through the years", said John Rosenow, the National Arbor Day Foundation's Executive Director. "The Tree City USA award is an excellent indication that there is a solid foundation for that process of improvement."

Fire Department Offers Safety Classes

The Glenview Fire Department will be conducting a Babysitter Orientation program on Saturday, May 11 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Students will be instructed in basic first aid procedures, fire safety, home security, and infant CPR techniques. Participants must be at least 10 years old. Pre-registration is required by calling 724-2141. Enrollment is limited. Students should bring a sack lunch, notebook and pencil.

The Fire Department will also hold two American Heart Association (AHA) CPR classes in the month of May. Adult, child and infant CPR procedures, along with Heimlich Maneuver choking procedures will be taught.

The first class is a two-session class on Wednesday evenings, May 15 and 22 from 7 to 10 p.m. Attendance is required both evenings for AHA recognition.

The second class will be one session, on Saturday, May 18 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Pre-registration is required for the classes by calling 724-2141. Enrollment is limited. Students should bring a sack lunch, notebook and pencil to the Saturday session.

Emergency telephone stickers are available at the police and fire stations, and the Village Hall. Both the Glenview Police and Fire Dispatch Centers are TDD equipped to communicate with the hearing and/or speech impaired.

E-9-1-1 Coming in 1992

On November 7, 1989, Glenview residents voted in favor of a referendum to establish an enhanced 9-1-1 telephone system in the Village and authorized a surcharge of \$1.00 per month for each telephone line. That surcharge should now appear on bills for all telephone lines located in the Village. Surcharge revenues are accumulating to cover the costs associated with the establishment of this emergency telephone system.

Illinois Bell Telephone, in conjunction with the ICC, has established an implementation date of February 29, 1992 for Glenview's 9-1-1 telephone system.

Work being done in preparation for the activation of the system includes:

- ✓ developing and maintaining a telephone company master database for every address located in the Village,
- ✓ designing and installing dispatch equipment needed to receive the automatic number identification (ANI) and automatic location identification (ALI) signals at the police and fire departments,
- ✓ programming the switching equipment and software at telephone company central offices to link with the database,
- ✓ establishing overflow and call transfer agreements with adjacent communities,
- ✓ preparing specifications for remote monitoring and maintenance of the 9-1-1 hardware and software,
- ✓ developing procedures and training programs for police and fire department dispatch personnel,
- ✓ finalizing the system design and documentation to present at a hearing before the Illinois Commerce Commission for system approval.

Smoke Detectors Available

The Glenview Area Safety Council is sponsoring a smoke detector assistance program for eligible Glenview Area residents. Free smoke detectors will be available to qualifying low income senior citizens. If you are in need of a smoke detector and:

1. Reside in the Glenview area (including unincorporated areas)
2. Are 62 years of age or older
3. Have a total income of less than \$10,000 annually (\$12,000 if married),
