## Landscape Waste Program Information



With the coming of Fall, the Village of Glenview and its residents are faced with the question of what to do with their leaves. The Glenview Public Works Department does sweep up the leaves that fall in the street from parkways. However, we ask that the residents do not rake or sweep leaves or other debris into the street.

The Public Works Department is not equipped either with machines or employees to sweep up all the leaves in the Village. They do extra sweeping routes in order to keep up with the leaves but cannot take care of all the leaves which fall on the parkway and in residents' yards. The street sweepers are not equipped to handle large types of debris such as garden waste, sticks, or pieces of lumber which damage the sweeping equipment.

Residents are asked to bag the leaves from their yards as they do any other landscape waste. Stickers can be purchased from the waste haulers, at the Village Hall Monday through Friday, between 8 am and 4 pm, and at the Police Department between 4 pm and 8 pm Monday through Friday, 9 am to 5 pm on Saturdays, and noon to 5 pm on Sundays. The stickers are \$1.50 each. Yard waste bags are available at the Village Hall, and at the following locations for 26 cents each:

## Used Motor Oil Recycling Program Expands

Carl's Automotive located at 2010 Lehigh Avenue joins the Service Stations in the Glenview area that have volunteered to serve as drop off sites that will accept used motor oil. The stations reserve the right to restrict the quantity of oil any one person or family may deposit with them, and the times of the day that they will accept used oil.

Please do not drop off containers or materials of any sort at the listed locations when they are not open for business. Such practice places the businesses that accept used oil at great risk, and jeopardize the cooperation of those businesses in our recycling program.

When recycling oil, it is extremely important that you do not mix any other materials or liquids with the used oil. This can contaminate the entire process, and force the materials to be disposed of by a special waste hauler at exorbitant costs. So please, used oil only.

**H.U.D. Section 8...** The waiting list will reopen on Sept. 11 for only a few days. If you meet the following guidelines you may be eligible for rent assistance. To qualify, annual income for one must be less than \$16,400, for 2 less than \$18,750. Applications will be taken over the phone by calling 1-312-663-5447. This number will remain busy so keep calling until your call is accepted. Once you have been assigned a number on the waiting list, it may take at least one year to receive financial assistance. The Section 8 certificate/voucher may help persons pay a part of their rent for an apartment or mobile home, if the landlord is willing to accept it.
