### Newspaper



- \* Any inserts found in a newspaper are accepted
- \* No magazines, junk mail, or other paper
- \* Place into brown grocery bags or bundle with string and deposit into container
- \* Newspaper may be placed next to the recycling container.

### Glass Bottles and Jars

- \* Remove all lids and metal rings, rinse bottles and jars
- \* Labels can be left on
- \* Deposit both clear and colored glass into container

### Food and Beverage Cans

- \* All metal and aluminum cans are accepted
- \* Remove paper labels and rinse food cans
- \* All cans may be flattened, no plastic lids or caps
- \* Deposit all cans into the container

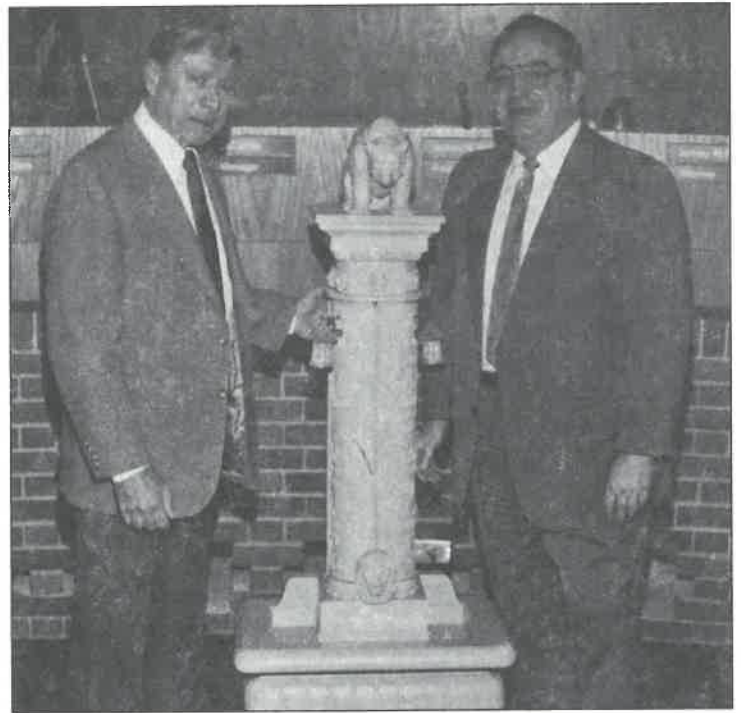
## Contractors Licenses Required

General Contractors: \$50.00 per year  
Subcontractors: \$35.00 per year

## Law Enforcement Career Opportunities

The Glenview Police Department will be conducting police officer eligibility exams in the near future. Qualified individuals interested in a law enforcement career are encouraged to submit an application. Applications will be available following an orientation session to be held February 8, 1990, at 7:30 P.M. in the Glenview Village Hall, 1225 Waukegan Road. Applicants must be U.S. citizens, age 21-35 at time of exam as mandated by law, possess vision correctable to 20/30 with primary color distinction, a high school diploma or G.E.D., and a valid driver's license.

Placement on the police candidate eligibility list is based upon the candidate successfully completing a physical fitness exam, written exam, background investigation, and psychological evaluation. Prior to appointment, candidates must pass a medical examination.

**P.A.C.E.:** Special transportation services are intended to serve persons who are severely mobility-limited. Persons who are wheelchair bound, unable to climb 3 standard steps, or persons who are both legally blind and deaf are considered severely mobility-limited and thereby eligible for door to door services providing transportation to medical appointments, shopping, or work. Cost is \$2.00 per one way trip. Medical certification is required to verify eligibility. Contact PACE at (708) 364-7223 or Carol Karol at the Village Hall for an application.

Village Board meetings are held the first and third Tuesdays of each month, in the Village Hall, at 7:30 p.m. Residents are always welcome at the Board meetings. Those wanting to speak on agenda items may fill out cards at the door and hand them to the secretary; those wanting to speak on nonagenda items must make advance arrangements with the Village Manager's Office.

Rejected referring a petition for annexation and zoning of property at the northeast corner of Milwaukee Ave. and Countryside Ln. to the Plan Commission for public hearings.

Authorized a portable radio purchase in the amount of \$25,000 from Motorola, Inc.

Approved a Zoning Board of Appeals recommendation to grant a conditional use at 1216 Waukegan Road permitting a catering business.

Granted a conditional use at 1625 Waukegan Road for the operation of a Subway Sandwich Shop.

Adopted an anti-scavenging ordinance to protect the recycling materials and containers from theft.

Approved a conditional use for the Glenview Park District utility building at 2320 Glenview Road to permit a maintenance building and site improvements to the maintenance yard.
