The rules are as follows:

 - It must be on paper or card stock exactly 8 1/2 by 11 inches.
 - Your name, address, and phone number must be written or printed plainly on the back of the drawing.

 - Entries received after 5pm Friday, January 15, will not be eligible.
 - All drawings submitted become the property of the Village of Glenview and none will be returned.
- Bring your drawing to the Village Manager's office at the Village Hall by **4pm Friday, January 15, 1988.**

Progress report:

County board OKs landfill site for north-west suburban use

Progress on establishing a new north-west suburban landfill (actually, a "balefill," where garbage compressed at other sites would be buried) is slow, but sure.

On November 16 the Cook County Board approved (14 to 2) a 410-acre site, formerly a strip-mined gravel pit, in an unincorporated area southeast of Elgin, near the intersection of Illinois 25 and Bartlett Road.

Approval — requested by the Northwest Municipal Conference, of which Glenview and 30 other municipalities are members — came after the longest series of hearings ever conducted by the county Board of Zoning Appeals. (The board first heard the matter in January of 1986, and finally gave it unanimous approval on October 21, 1987.)

As the Village of Bartlett disproves of the site because it is only 113 feet above its water supply, the Northwest Municipal Conference must now convince the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency that a balefill on the property will not threaten the environment. If the EPA issues a permit, the site could accommodate some half-million tons of garbage per year, beginning in late 1989.

TAX RELIEF is available for seniors and disabled persons, including renters, home owners, and owners of mobile homes. Financial aid is available for approved prescriptions for victims of heart disease, abnormal blood pressure, arthritis, and diabetes. To qualify you must, during 1987, be at least 65 or at least 16 and disabled, and live in a household with a 1986 income less than \$14,000. Claims for the 1986 tax year must be filed no later than December 31, 1987. Forms are available from the Senior Coordinator at the Village Hall, who will help with the filing process. Please bring the following documentation when you make your application: 1 - **Proof of gross income** (for all members of the household) for the 90 days preceding your application date. 2 - **A copy of your current heating bill** (excluding cooking gas) and light bill. (If heating costs are included in rent, a renter/landlord verification form will be provided.) 3 - **Social Security numbers for all members of the household.** 4 - **If heat is disconnected,** proof of payment of at least 10% of the past 90-day gross income.

Readers have asked what "special use" and "conditional use" mean, why they are granted to certain properties, and what impact each grant has upon the surrounding area. The terms are interchangeable (from now on we will use only "conditional use" when reporting such status) and indicate property use other than that stated for the district in the municipal zoning code.

According to the code, conditional use is "limited to public and quasi-public uses affected with the public interest, or uses which may have unique, special, or unusual impact upon the use or enjoyment to neighboring property, meeting reasonable conditions and standards, and permitted only after a public hearing." (Italics are ours.)

Public and quasi-public uses include day-care centers, training schools, drive-in food and beverage establishments, dry-cleaning and laundry depots, public buildings, and businesses not usually considered compatible with neighboring property values. Conditional use may be granted if considered necessary and/or desirable for public convenience without diminishing surrounding property values or changing a neighborhood's safety or character.

Application for conditional use must be filed with the Zoning Board of Appeals, and a notice of public hearing published in the *Glenview Announcements* 15 to 30 days before the hearing. At the hearing, everyone wishing to make objection to the pro-

posal is allowed to speak. The zoning board then makes a pro or con recommendation to the Village Board. Readers interested in such matters can keep abreast of them by watching for notices, attending hearings, and learning the details of each case in question.
