## No overnight street parking Dec.-March

No parking is allowed on Glenview streets between 2 and 6am December 1 through March 31. Please warn holiday visitors of the restriction.

When it snows, village crews begin clearing during early-morning hours, and parked cars make the job nearly impossible. Even if no snow falls, the parking ban remains in effect, and violators may have vehicles towed at their own expense. *Out-of-state licenses do not exempt vehicles from the no-parking rule.*

Those with urgent needs for on-street overnight parking should immediately inform the Village Hall, in writing, stating their reasons.

## Please don't put leaves in the street!

Leaves that fall naturally onto Glenview roadways will be vacuumed by the Public Works street sweeper, so it may be a temptation to sweep yours into the street to get rid of them. Please DON'T.

Village equipment is not capable of dealing with thick accumulations. If left on the street, piles of leaves will clog sewers and cause flooding the next time it rains.

If bagging or composting leaves is too much trouble, either leave them where they fall to insulate and fertilize the soil, or rake them under trees and shrubs to enrich next year's growth.

## Rotary's "PolioPlus" fights 6 child diseases

Rotary International, UNICEF, and the World Health Organization have joined in an effort to eradicate polio and 5 other childhood diseases by 1990.

Glenview Rotarians and the Glenbrook South Interact Club are part of a world effort to raise \$219 million for the PolioPlus Program to buy enough vaccine to immunize every child in the world against polio, measles, tuberculosis, diphtheria, whooping cough, and tetanus. The goal of local Rotarians and Interactors is \$15,000.

## Household waste disposal rules

New residents (and those who may have forgotten the rules), please take notice.

Household waste is picked up at service doors/areas of Glenview residences (back, side, or garage doors, or other designated spots) within private property lot lines. You pay for this pickup service, so please don't haul waste cans out to the curb, where they can bounce into the street, obstruct traffic, and offend your neighbors.

If you have *disposable* containers (plastic bags containing clean yard refuse or newspapers), these may be placed at the curb, after 7pm the night before collection. Bundled branches no longer

*Garbage* is usually wet or moist refuse that could attract insects or animals (squirrels, mice, rats, raccoons, possums, or dogs). *Trash* is usually dry (waste paper, cans, cartons, and the like). Both garbage and trash are household waste.

**THANKS TO GLENVIEW RESIDENTS** who carry plastic bags along to pick up cans, papers, and other unsightly debris while taking walks or jogging. We appreciate their cooperation in keeping Glenview clean and beautiful.

**CERTAIN LOCAL DOG OWNERS** (they know who they are) exhibit inexcusably bad manners and flout the law by letting dogs run at large or walk on public properties clearly signed **NO DOGS ALLOWED**. Even worse, these scofflaws fail to pick up animal excrement, and are rude to those who complain.

It's unfortunate that the majority of us must live with such filthy behavior, as police can't always find the dogowners who pollute our parks and schoolyards.

Glenview law clearly states that whenever a pet is off its owner's property, it must be leashed, and the walker must carry and use some equipment (a scoop or a plastic glove) to pick up and carry away animal excrement for proper disposal in toilet or garbage can.

Prompt removal and proper disposal of animal feces, year-round, are essential to public health. Kindly cooperate.
