Sewer repairs moving westward

Repairs to village sanitary sewers, to fulfill the Metropolitan Sanitary District's requirements for prevention of storm-water seepage into sanitary sewers, began on the east side of Glenview this summer and is continuing westward until all lines needing repair have been serviced. Abbott Construction Company of Northbrook is the contractor.

The project is partially funded by a "Build Illinois" grant of \$68,000, about half of which has already been received. The village will pay the remainder with budgeted monies from the capital projects fund.

Sewers needing repair were spotted by a Harza Engineering study conducted in 1982, when village sanitary lines were inspected with television devices to determine where storm water was entering.

Glenview students compete to name Officer Friendly's assistant

Glenview children in grades K through 3 (ages 5-9) are competing to name the new Glenview Police Department robot, a remote-controlled miniature car that helps Officer John Good teach safety in the schools this fall.

The mechanical charmer stands more than 2 feet tall, weighs about 80 pounds, listens to questions and gives answers, winks, delivers speeches on safety matters, and — if the mood is right — can probably sing like Michael Jackson.

Officer Good, as "Officer Friendly," visited District 30 and 34

schools September 8 through 11, distributing contest application forms.

Contest deadline is Monday, October 5, when children will turn in entries to their school principals' offices. Administrative assistant Judy Wallace of District 34, Officer Good, and Joe Wade (Assistant to the Glenview Village Manager), will be the judges.

The student submitting the winning name will receive a safety board game and appear with the robot in an upcoming issue of the *Glenview Newsletter*.
