Library board to fill trustee vacancy by appointment

A vacancy on the Glenview Public Library's board of trustees, caused by the recent resignation of Rachelle McClarren, will be filled by appointment. The unexpired term runs through March of 1989.

Duties of a library trustee include participation in determining library policies, budgets, and services, and serving on certain library committees.

Monthly board meetings are held on the third Wednesday, 7:30pm, at the library, 1930 Prairie Street. Com-

mittee meetings are held at various times.

Qualified residents of the Village of Glenview interested in being considered for the appointment are invited to send resumes to the library or call either library board president John Arnold or Executive Librarian Peter Bury (729-7500).

Applications must be received no later than Wednesday, October 21. The appointment is expected to be made by December 1.



Trick-or-Treat time set for Saturday, Oct. 31, 2 - 8pm

Halloween Trick-or-Treat time will be observed in Glenview Saturday, October 31, between 2 and 8pm only. Residents willing to treat children please turn on outside lights and restrain pets. Consider giving nonedible items such as pencils, pennies, whistles, or balloons.

The Glenview Police Department urges parents to follow these nine safety rules:

- 1 - Allow children to go house-to-house only during the specified 6-hour period.
 - 2 - Accompany children yourself, or make sure another responsible adult does so.
 - 3 - Watch every item collected, and make a mental note of where it was received.
 - 4 - Don't accept unwrapped food.
 - 5 - Don't eat anything during the trip.
 - 6 - Visit only the houses in your own neighborhood, and then only houses of people you know.
 - 7 - Don't allow children to go to dark houses.
 - 8 - Be careful crossing streets.
 - 9 - When you get home, examine each treat carefully before eating. Discard anything that looks unsuitable.
- Have a safe and happy Halloween!

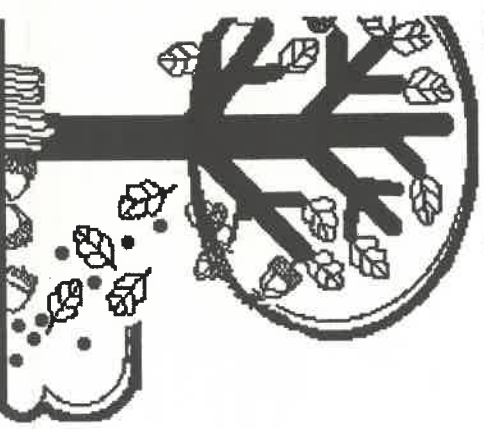
Bag or use them, but ... please — don't put them in the street!

Autumn leaves are a headache to some residents and a boon to others. Depending upon how you feel about leaves, you may gather them for disposal, heap them on your garden or rake them under trees and shrubs as natural fertilizer, or let them lie where they fall to enrich the soil.

One prohibition: Please don't put them in the street!

Leaves that fall naturally onto roadways will be vacuumed by the Public Works Department's street sweeper, and it may be a temptation to add yours. Please don't!

Heavy accumulations or piles of leaves are dangerous. They are traffic hazards, can be fatal to children and pets hiding or playing in them, clog



the sweeper and the sewers, and cause flooding the next time it rains.

Please don't contribute to these fall problems.

MOST FATAL HOME FIRES start at night. You're asleep and unaware of burning odors. Carbon monoxide or other toxic gases may already have already rendered you unconscious. You could die in your bed without ever knowing your house was on fire. Properly installed and maintained smoke detectors will sound the alarm and give you time to save yourself, your family, and possibly most of your property. The Glenview Fire Department says that a detector on every level of your home can double your chances of survival. Detectors are inexpensive and easy to maintain. Test them once a month and change batteries once a year. Do it on your birthday to assure yourself another year of life.
