County property tax affects most of us

The Cook County Assessor is required by law to reassess one-quarter of the county's property every year, in order to keep assessments in line with current market values.

Properties in the north and northwest suburbs, last reassessed in 1984, will be reassessed in 1988. Each homeowner will receive a "Notice of Proposed Assessed Valuation" by mail, stating the old assessment, the reassessment, and the characteristics of the subject property as they appear in the files of the Cook County Assessor.

The notice should be examined carefully and promptly for accuracy; errors must be challenged within 20 days. Your township assessor is your

liaison with the County Assessor, and will provide professional help and advice upon request. Call your township office if you have questions.*

HOMEOWNER TAX EXEMPTION

Homeowners of any age are entitled to the Homeowner Exemption for dwellings owner-occupied prior to January 1 of the taxable year on which the owner-occupant paid the real estate taxes.

A maximum of \$3,500 is deducted as an offset against increases in equalized assessment. Cards are sent automatically by the Cook County Assessor, and eligible homeowners need only complete and return them.

HOMESTEAD TAX EXEMPTION

Homeowners 65 and older are entitled to a Homestead Exemption in addition to the Homeowner Exemption for dwellings they have owned and occupied before January 1 of the taxable year, and for which they paid real-estate taxes. Senior homeowners must apply for the exemption — it is not automatic.

To apply, take the following documents to your township office:

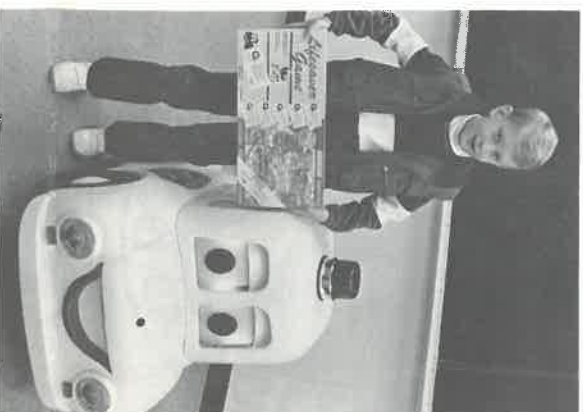
1 — **Proof of age** (any one of the following): Birth or baptismal certificate, passport, naturalization papers, or Social Security form SSA 2458 showing birthdate. A married woman applying must also submit a marriage certificate to validate name change.

2 — **Proof of ownership** of the property (any one of the following): Warranty Deed, Quitclaim Deed, Trust Deed, Torrens Certificate, Proprietary Lease, Articles of Agreement to Purchase, Owner's Policy Schedule A, or deed in Trust with Trust Agreement.

3 — **Copy of a paid tax bill.**
