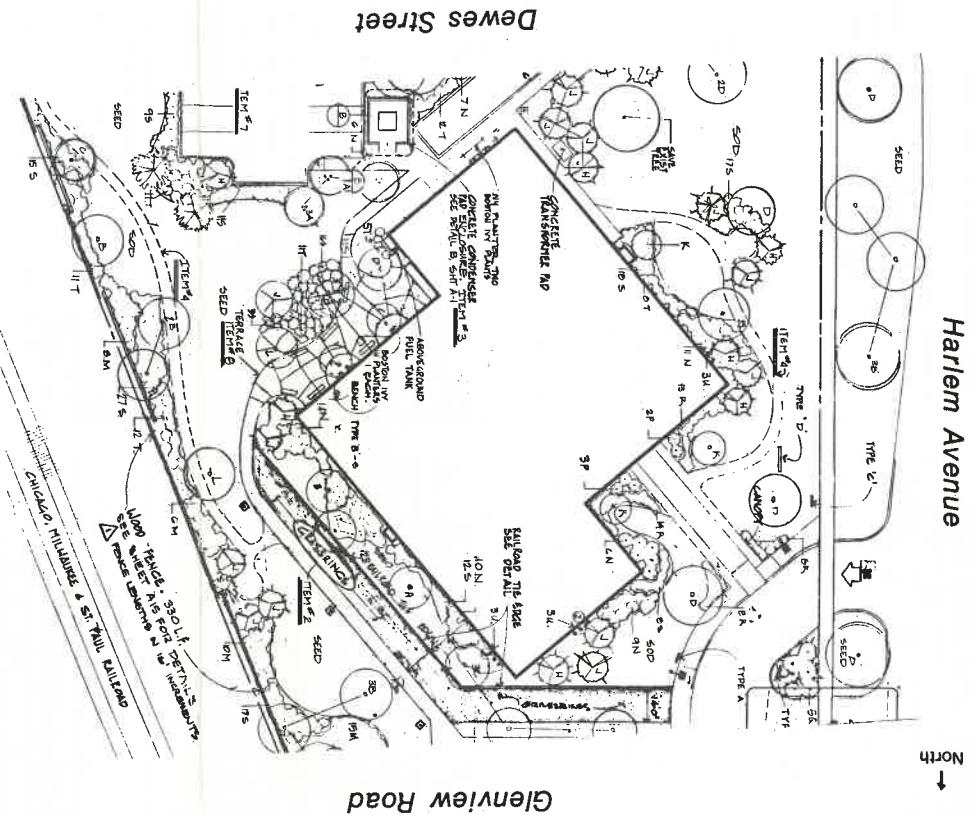

## Elderly Housing Complex started

**C**onstruction of the 5-story, 80-unit Glenview Elderly Housing Complex, which will be underway as soon as final clearance is received from Washington D.C. (possibly before you receive this newsletter), will be at the southeast corner of Glenview Road and Harlem Avenue.

To be built with the assistance of a \$4.55 million loan from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the complex will be managed by Evangelical Health Systems of Oak Brook, which maintain similar facilities in Downers Grove and Barrington.

Included will be 48 1-bedroom apartments, 23 efficiency units, 4 handicapped units, and 5 wheelchair models, each equipped with range and refrigerator. The building will also

have a community dining room, kitchen, atrium, and game and craft rooms.

Designed in conformance with the Illinois Capital Development Board's standards of accessibility, the residence will be adjacent to train and bus transportation, the Glenview Public Library, shopping facilities, and very close to the Glenview Fire Department paramedic service.

Construction work is by A. J. Maggioro of Mt. Prospect, and is expected to be complete by this time next year.

Applications, rental costs, and criteria for eligibility are not yet available. Please watch future issues of this newsletter for further information.

- Entries received after 5pm January 15 will not be eligible.
- Entries become the property of the Village of Glenview.

Judging will be done by a panel of Glenview residents, and the decision of the judges will be final. First Place winner receives \$100 cash; 2 runners up receive \$25 each; 7 ribbons will be awarded to the other top 10 finalists.

**TTD (TELECOMMUNICATION DEVICE for the Deaf)** now reaches the Illinois Department on Aging toll-free number, 1-800-252-8966, weekdays from 8:30am to 5pm. Call to find senior centers, meals, transportation programs, and access information about in-home or adult day care.

**A RESIDENTIAL** affordable payment program allows households to keep primary and secondary utility services by paying 12% of household income. Those with regulated gas or electric service qualifying for IHEAP (Illinois Home Energy Assistance Program) are eligible. Call the center for full information.

### **Snow on the way**

No parking is allowed on village streets between 2 and 6am, from 12:01am Monday, December 1, through midnight March 31, 1987. Please warn family members and guests of the restriction.

When it snows, village crews begin clearing streets in the early morning hours, and parked cars make the job impossible.

Even if no snow falls during the night, cars may be towed if found violating the ordinance (#2260, posted on all major thoroughfares entering Glenview).

If you need off-street parking for house guests during the holidays, please make arrangements as soon as possible. If you have an exceptional need for street parking, please call the Village Manager's office to see whether special arrangements can be made.

**DO NOT SHOVEL, BLOW OR PLOW SNOW onto any part of a public street or sidewalk.** Instruct those hired for snow removal that it is illegal in Glenview to cover or block a public thoroughfare with snow. Such blockage creates hazards for both pedestrians and motorists.

Please remove snow and ice from your sidewalks promptly. Remember that pedestrians, including mail carriers, children and seniors, use them every day.

**COLD WEATHER** can trigger heart attack, frostbite, asthma, and broken bones from falls, and is especially risky for the elderly. Hypothermia (a deep drop in body heat) can be fatal. Special care should be taken to keep warm at night. Body temperature below 95F requires medical help for survival — call paramedics immediately.

**THE WATER DEPARTMENT** advises that meters behind glass blocks cannot be read accurately unless the glass is clean and unobstructed. It's also a good idea to compare inside meter readings with outside (remote) readers to catch discrepancies early. Remote readers, enabling readings to be made without entering houses, are available free. Installation takes about an hour. If you would like one, please call the Water Department, 724-1700 X259.

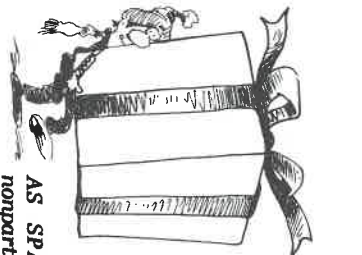

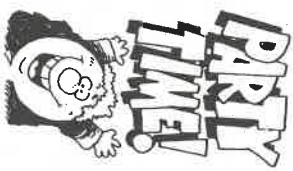
