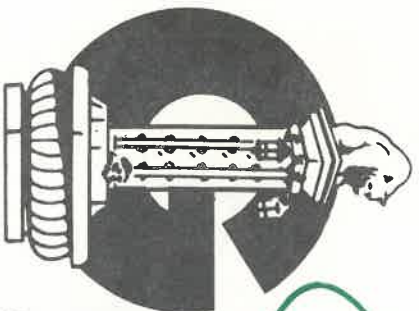

## The 1987 municipal budget

### --- A report to the shareholders

The recently adopted 1987 budget of the Village of Glenview, totaling \$17,454,832, is a fiscal blueprint of village operations for the coming year.

The total includes corporate, pension, water/sewer, library, and debt service funds, and represents an increase of \$926,243 (5.6%) over 1986.

Because you, as residents, are municipally shareholders, you are entitled to a yearly synopsis of revenues, expenditures, and activities.

Of particular interest is the Corporate Fund, which finances basic village services — public works, fire, police, development, and finance.

### Revenue

1987 Corporate Fund revenues are projected at \$10.1 million — an increase of \$800,000 over 1986, due to overall village growth in sales, utilities, properties, and the state income tax.

**Sales taxes**, Glenview's largest contributor to the Corporate Fund, are expected to rise from \$2.5 million in 1986 to \$2.8 in 1987 — 40% from automobiles, 18% from retail food.

**Utility taxes**, projected at \$2.2 million for 1987, will show an increase of \$200,000 over 1986.

**Property taxes** are expected to increase by \$100,000, due to annexations and new construction. Even with a

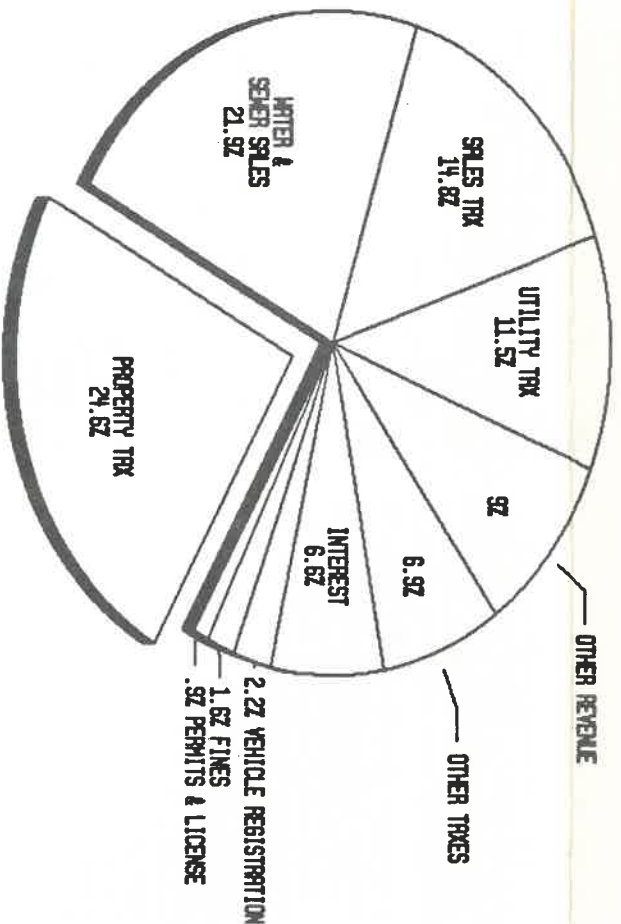

fixed tax rate, revenue grows because of higher assessed property valuation. The hotel tax (5%) accounted for \$69,000 in 1986. The projection for 1987 is \$134,000. As more hotels are built this revenue will increase.

### Expenditures

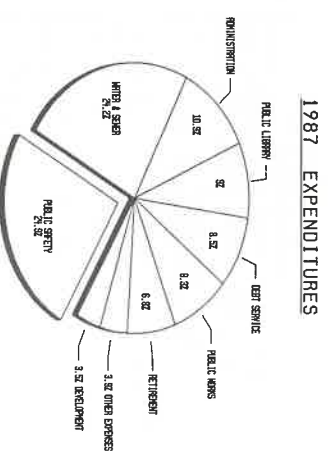
Most expenditures are for the cost of existing personnel and equipment, but some others should be mentioned:

The 1987 budget transfers approximately \$400,000 of Corporate Fund revenue to a Reserve Fund, the first installment of a 5-year plan to replenish village reserves.

At the end of 5 years the reserve balance will be approximately \$2.5 million, which will serve as insurance against fluctuations or delays in tax revenues, monetary judgments, natural disasters, and other fiscal contingencies.

**New expenditures** in 1987 are for 3 additional firefighter/paramedics and one part-time senior services coordinator. The coordinator, hired through the North Shore Senior Center in Winnetka, serves as a staff base for information, resources, referral, and special programs for Glenview's elderly and families with elderly members.

Finally, in 1987 Glenview will draft a **Comprehensive Plan**, to record existing land uses, identify annexation and land-use issues, and serve as a guide for future development. The 1987 budget covers costs involved in setting up the plan.



**GLENVIEW MAIL CARRIERS** will not risk injury where residents or businesses fail to keep access to mailboxes clear of snow and ice. If the path to the mailbox is hazardous underfoot, an attempt will be made to deliver mail the next delivery day, or on subsequent days when access is safe. Glenview Postmaster Mark Stephan asks for salting or sanding of paths and steps to mailboxes, whenever that is necessary. "We want our carriers on their feet to deliver mail, not incapacitated from falls on snow and ice."



# File now for spring election

Glenview residents interested in running for openings on the Village Board, the Library Board or the Park Board should begin now to collect the necessary documents: (1) Statements of Candidacy, (2) Statements of Economic Interests, and (3) Nominating Petitions. There are 3 openings on each board.

The final date for filing is **Monday, January 26**. The election will be held **Tuesday, April 7**.

A Statement of Economic Interests form must be filed by each candidate. Forms are available at the Skokie branch of the County Clerk's office, 5600 Old Orchard Road. When returned, receipts will be given, which must be included with candidate petitions and statements of candidacy.

Meantime, petition forms (available at stationery or office-supply stores) should be circulated for signatures of local registered voters. Those who circulate the petitions must also be local registered voters.

#### Number of signatures required:

For a **Village Board office**, a party candidate must have no fewer signatures of registered voters than 5% of the number of ballots cast at the last village election (2,240), or no fewer than 112. An independent candidate must have at least 5% (or no fewer than 112), but no more than 8%, or 179.

For a **Library Board office**, a candidate needs the signatures of only 50 registered voters.

For a **Park Board office**, a candidate must have no fewer signatures of registered voters than 2% of the number of ballots cast at the last village election (2,240), or at least 45.

Candidates must present their receipts for the Economic Interests Statement, Statement of Candidacy, and completed petition forms to the

## Snow on the way

No parking is allowed on village streets between 2 and 6am, from 12:01am Monday, December 1, through midnight March 31, 1987. Please warn family members and guests of the restriction.

When it snows, village crews begin clearing streets in the early morning hours, and parked cars make the job impossible.

Even if no snow falls during the night, cars may be towed if found violating the ordinance (#2260, posted on all major thoroughfares entering Glenview).

If you have an exceptional need for street parking, please call the Village Manager's office to see whether special arrangements can be made.

**DO NOT SHOVEL, BLOW OR PLOW SNOW** onto any part of a public street or sidewalk. Instruct those hired for snow removal that it is illegal in Glenview to cover or block a public thoroughfare with snow. Such blockage creates hazards for both pedestrians and motorists.

Please remove snow and ice from your sidewalks promptly. Remember that pedestrians, including mail carriers, children and seniors, use them every day.
