Housing assistance for seniors

Glenview residents 65 or older who pay either rent or real-estate taxes and have been village residents for at least two years, may qualify for financial help through the Senior Housing Assistance Program.

Gross annual income of applicants must not exceed \$10,000 for a single person or \$12,000 for a married couple. A limited number of seniors will be chosen on the basis of need.

Applications must be filed **on or before Friday, March 13**. All information submitted is kept confidential.

Application forms are now available at the Village Hall (1225 Waukegan Road), the Senior Center (901 Shermer Road), the Glenview Public Library (1930 Glenview Road), and the Glenview Chamber of Commerce (2320 Glenview Road).

Tax help available for seniors

Seniors will do well this year to use the **free tax service offered by Tax-Aide**, the AARP program that helps senior citizens fill out federal and state tax forms. Tax-Aide is available through April 15.

Confusing as the new tax regulations and forms may seem, they can be readily explained by free AARP Tax-Aide counselors, who are trained and tested qualified by the Internal Revenue Service.

PARKING PRIVILEGES FOR THE DISABLED are available to cars displaying handicapped plates or displaying valid official handicapped parking cards. (Temporary cards are issued to those with temporary disabilities.) Call 1-800-252-2904 (toll free) for application information. **Handicapped privileges do not include parking in posted "No Parking" areas** — loading zones, public building entrances and exits, near hydrants, etc. — or where parking could be a traffic hazard. **Privileges apply only to spaces marked with the handicapped symbol.** (Other drivers who use these spaces are subject to \$50 fines.) Meter fees (except for 30 minutes or less) need not be paid by operators of cars with handicapped privileges.

THE GLENVIEW POLICE offer the following advice to seniors:

Use direct-deposit service for pension and Social Security checks. ... Work out a "buddy" system with a friend; check on each other's welfare daily. ... Women living alone should use only a first initial in directories and apartment lobbies. ... Purses should be gripped tightly and held close to the body, never left unattended on counters or in shopping carts. ... When threatened with physical force, don't resist; try to be calm and observe all you can about the assailant. ... If you haven't had your free home-security inspection, arrange for it now; call Officer John Good, 729-5000, weekdays between 9am and 5pm.

NO STREET PARKING is allowed in Glenview between 2 and 6am during the winter months, whether or not there is snow. Parked cars make street cleaning impossible, and cars illegally parked may be towed away.

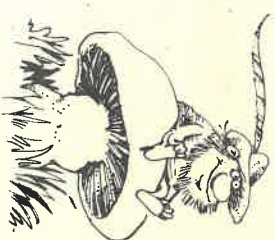
