## Board OKs building permit fee increase

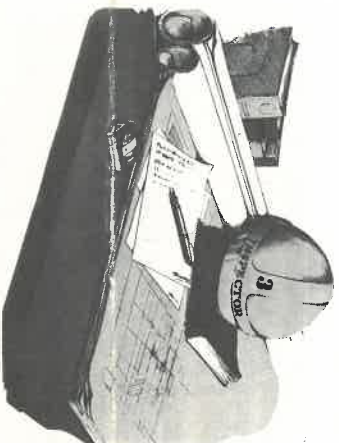
The Village Board has approved increases in fees for Building Permits and Plan Reviews, and the increases went into effect March 10.

Glenview Development Director Mary Bak points out that local fees had been substantially lower than in surrounding villages, and had not increased in 10 years.

Building Permit fees are now based on values of structures to be built, a system used by most municipalities in this area. Values are determined by a national quarterly publication estimating and regionally adjusting costs per square foot.

Fees for plan reviews are being adjusted to correspond with time spent in checking for compliance with Village codes.

Current permit fees: For single-family new construction, \$60; single-family addition or remodeling, \$35 (for value less than \$50,000) and \$50 (more than \$50,000); commercial/industrial new construction, additions, and remod-



ing, \$50 (less than \$10,000), \$90 (\$10,001-\$25,000), \$150 (\$25,001-\$50,000), and \$175 (\$50,001-\$100,000.)

Fee for elevator inspection is \$40, reflecting a cost increase by Thompson Elevator Inspection Service. Drive-way permit fee is \$25.

## Choose contractors with care

Especially during spring and summer months, swindlers play confidence games by offering home improvements at "bargain" prices.

Beware of someone who comes to the door selling a cheap blackout job for your driveway. (It may be done with used crankcase oil that glistens but never dries.)

Beware of unsolicited offers of roof or chimney repairs. Often the pitch is, "We're in your neighborhood, happened to notice your roof (or chimney) needs fixing, and can do it **right now** at a discount." (It's usually "right now" because they don't want you to have time to check.)

**When you want or need home repairs/improvements:**

- ✓ Get bids from contractors with established business addresses. It takes about 3 years for a contractor to establish a financially sound business and a good reputation with banks and suppliers.

- ✓ Ask for names and addresses of satisfied local customers, and call or

visit at least one. Check with the Chamber of Commerce or the Better Business Bureau if you have any doubts or questions.

- ✓ Check with the Building Department, 724-1700, to find out what licenses and permits you need. Make sure the contractor you pick is licensed to work in Glenview and has both workers' compensation and general liability insurance. (If not, you could be liable for any job-related accidents.)

- ✓ Don't be rushed. Discuss carefully and get a written agreement before the work begins.

Older people and women who live alone should be especially wary — con men consider them the easiest marks.

## Second annual event

### Safety Day Saturday, April 26

Glenview's second annual Safety Day will be observed on Saturday, April 26, from 10am to 2pm. Glenview Police and Fire Departments, the Glenbrook Fire District and the Glenview Area Safety Council will be the hosts, and Illinois State Police and Cook County Sheriff's Police officers have been invited to participate.

Events will run continuously from 10 to 2 at the following three locations: Glenview Fire Station (1815 Glenview Road), Glenbrook Station #7 (3507 Glenview Road), and Glenbrook Station #8 (1901 Landwehr Road).

Activities include bicycle safety inspection, fingerprinting and photographing of young children, and I-SEARCH identification packets for parents' use. **NOTE:** Parents must accompany children to be fingerprinted and photographed.

In conjunction with Safety Day, personnel at the three fire stations will offer a fire safety program designed to teach both youngsters and parents how to plan home fire drills and act under actual fire conditions.

Fire apparatus, always of interest to visitors, will be on display at all three stations.

## Cable customers please note:

As subscribers now know, Cablenet has announced that its rates will increase as of June 1.

In response to many calls to the Village Hall and the Northshore Cable Commission, village officials remind subscribers that **local governments lost their power to regulate cable television rates** when Congress passed the 1984 Cable Communications Act.

While Congress was considering the legislation, Glenview — along with other members of the Northwest Municipal Conference and the National League of Cities — objected, calling it an infringement of local authority. **Our objection was overruled.**

The far-reaching changes made by the 1984 legislation have not, however, lessened official concern regarding cable service and subscriber problems with operations. Village personnel and the Northshore Cable Commission will continue to assist residents insofar as the law allows.

Subscribers with questions about increased rates, however, must talk to Cablenet direct, at 299-9240. (Village authorities can sympathize, but not help, because of the provisions of the 1984 federal law.)

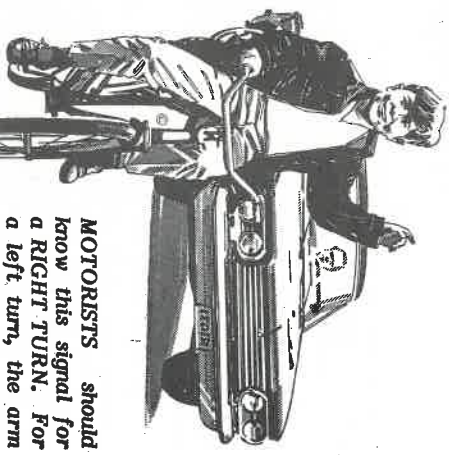

**BULKY REFUSE** (such items as furniture, large appliances, crates, trees, tree roots, and branches 4 feet or longer, carpeting, and construction materials) will be picked up by disposal contractors if placed on the parkway no earlier than 7pm on the night before collection. There will be an extra charge, depending upon size and number of items. (Yard refuse is collected at curbside at no extra charge, as long as there are no more than 3 bundles of branches per residence.)

## Do you know the hand signals?

**R**iding a bicycle on a public roadway is exactly like driving a car. Cyclists must ride WITH traffic, single-file in the right-hand lane, as close to the curb as possible, and obey ALL traffic signs, signals, and speed limits.

Adults, most of whom are motorists, should know the Illinois rules of the road; children should be familiar with them through Officer Friendly's bicycle-safety program in the Glenview schools.



**MOTORISTS** should know this signal for a RIGHT TURN. For a left turn, the arm is extended horizontally. For STOP, the elbow is bent, fingers down. Bikers should always use hand signals, and motorists should understand and respect them.

Never attach your bike or yourself to any other vehicle.

On 2-lane roads, STOP for a standing school bus, regardless of which way the bus is headed. On 4-lane roads, only the traffic behind the bus need stop. Bikers, like motorists, may not resume travel until the bus moves, or until the driver waves you on.

Don't make U-turns on hills, or where there are "No U-Turn" signs. Where U-turns are allowed, look behind for following traffic, ahead for oncoming traffic, and give a left-turn signal.

**Hazards:** The driver's door of a parked car may open suddenly and strike you, causing a painful, if not fatal, injury. Be ready for quick stops. Gratings can overturn your bike, and traffic entering from driveways or curbs may not be able to see you. Be alert for such situations.

**Parents:** Get free copies of "Bicycle Rules of the Road" at the Glenview Police Department and have your children read it. Remember: Bikers of any age may be ticketed for breaking the rules of the road.

Register your bike free at the Police Department, 1215 Waukegan Road. Registration will identify the bike in case it is stolen and recovered.

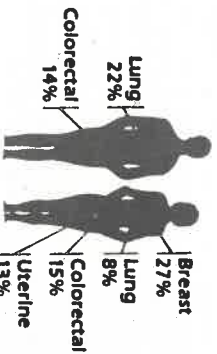
**Hand signals:** For a left turn, extend left arm horizontally, forefinger pointed; for a right turn, extend arm bent at elbow, hand up; for a stop, extend arm bent at elbow, hand down. A basket is required for books or packages. Both hands must be on the handlebars except when signaling.

Use bicycle paths wherever provided. You may also ride on sidewalks, IF you give pedestrians the right-of-way and ample warning of your approach. Shouting and whistling can be meaningless, frightening, or rude; use a horn or bell to warn pedestrians.

Brakes must be adequate for stopping on dry and level pavement, and the bike must have a horn or bell audible at 100 feet. Whistles and sirens are illegal. If ridden after dusk or before dawn, the bike must have a white headlight visible for at least 500 feet, and a red rear reflector.

Wear light-colored clothes or reflective tape at night, and put some tape on handlebars, frame and fenders. Wheel reflectors and arm and leg lights are available at low cost and could save your life.

**Handlebar-riding is illegal.** Only one person may ride on a single-rider bike, except that an adult may carry a small child — if the child is securely attached to the adult's body in a
