## New trees need your help to survive

**T**hrough the Suburban Tree Consortium (recently joined in order to obtain high-quality parkway trees to fill our future forestry requirements) Glenview has recently planted 251 new parkway specimens throughout the village.

**New trees are sensitive.** They must establish new root systems, become accustomed to new environment, and require gentle treatment and regular waterings for up to 3 years after being transplanted from the nurseries where they were nurtured.

The Glenview Public Works Department has handled initial waterings, but **if this spring and summer are dry seasons, residents must help the new parkway trees survive.**

This takes a little know-how. Remember that **tree roots need both air and moisture.** Overwatering can keep air from reaching the roots, particularly in the clay soil of our area, and can kill new trees. (Banging mowers into their trunks can kill them, too.)

Because the new parkway trees represent a substantial investment of your tax dollars, please note the following formula, recommended by the

## Police warn of thefts from parked cars

**G**lenview motorists should be careful to follow these rules of crime-prevention:

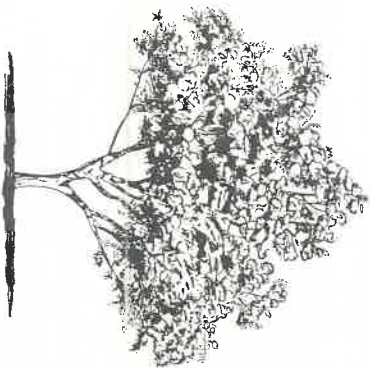
No matter where or when you park, don't leave anything on seats, floor, or rear shelf. **Put all-loose items in the trunk.**

**Remove radar detector from the dashboard and put it in the glove box.**

When you park in a public lot at night, or when you think it may be dark when you leave the lot, try to find a well-lighted space. **Cars in the shadows are vulnerable to theft or rifling.**

On-street overnight parking should be avoided. Park in a driveway if at all possible. **If you must park outdoors at home, install extra outdoor lighting.**

It shouldn't be necessary to remind you, but — judging by reports received by Glenview police — apparently it is: **Never park your car anywhere without locking it.**



Public Works Department, and follow it in case of insufficient rainfall:

**At regular intervals (7 to 10 days recommended), give each new parkway tree adjacent to your property at least 6, but no more than 10, gallons of water.** Gradual soaking for about half an hour with a very small stream from the hose is best, to avoid runoff and water wastage. Careful cultivation at the base with a hoe from time to time will help aerate the roots.

Thanks for your help in keeping Glenview "Tree City, USA."

**BULKY REFUSE** (furniture, large appliances, carpeting, trees and roots, branches 4 feet or longer, construction materials, etc.) will be taken by scavenger companies for an extra fee, depending upon size and number of items. **Please call your disposal contractor in advance to set a day for pickup and charges.** (Because extra truck space is needed for bulky items, pickups may not be made on your regular garbage disposal day.)

**CYCLISTS TRAVELING ON** Glenview Road and West Lake Avenue are advised to use sidewalks rather than roadways because of heavy traffic. (Cyclists are required by state law to obey all traffic signs and signals, be equipped with horns or bells to signal pedestrians, and give pedestrians the right-of-way.)

**PLEASE CONTRIBUTE** to the annual Independence Day celebration. **Those contributing \$25 or more will be acknowledged in a full-page ad in the local press and parade programs.** The easiest way is to send your family's tax-deductible donation when paying the water bill (which carries a reminder). ## Hydrant flushing may color water

**W**ater Department personnel are flushing hydrants Tuesdays through Fridays through the summer months, to ensure good flow conditions throughout the village in case of fire and other emergencies.

Flushing began at the east end of the water system and will work westward until all 2,000 hydrants have been treated.

During the flushing, customers in the immediate area will notice occasional water discoloration, which does not affect safety of drinking water, but may temporarily stain clothes being washed.

To make sure your laundry isn't affected, plan to wash on Saturdays, Sundays, and Mondays for the next few weeks. If you have questions, call the Water Department, 724-1700 X245.

# 1986-87 vehicle and pet licenses due in June; apply now

**A**pplications for Glenview vehicle stickers are mailed in May to residents who bought them last year. (New residents please pick them up at the Finance Department office, upper level, Village Hall, 1225 Waukegan Road.)

**Avoid crowds:** Mail forms back with checks payable to the Village of Glenview attached, or use the free drop box at the Village Hall. **Penalties apply after July 1, and higher penalties after August 1.**

Village stickers cost \$20 per passenger car (\$7.50 for seniors, but only one senior rate allowed per family), regardless of horsepower. Truck and RV fees are higher than last year (see the fee schedule printed on the application form).

If information on the form mailed is outdated, or if forms are received for vehicles no longer owned, make the necessary corrections and return to the Village Hall by mail or drop box, or call the Finance Department, 724-1700.

**P**et license application forms are printed at right. Please fill out a separate application form for each pet and return, via mail or drop box, with rabies certificate, veterinarian statement of neutering, and check payable to the Village of Glenview.

## Postmaster explains mail insurance rules

**A**ccording to Glenview Postmaster Mark Stephan, almost all mail handled by the U.S. Postal Service gets to its destination safely. But if you want to protect something from accidental damage or loss, you can always buy postal insurance.

Postal insurance is available up to \$500 for Fourth-Class (parcel and book-rate), Third-Class (business), and Priority or First-Class rates. (Express Mail is covered by limited insurance at no extra charge.)

Articles insured for more than \$25 require a receipt-of-delivery to be signed by the recipient and filed at the post office making the delivery.

Postmaster Stephan offers this advice: Send irreplaceable items, regardless of value, and anything worth more than \$500, by Registered Mail. **Don't overinsure** — payment for loss is limited to the actual value, less depreciation. (Insurance doesn't cover sentimental value or spoilage of perishables.)

If something you mailed has been lost or damaged, pick up claim forms at the post office and ask to have the filing procedure explained. The same forms are used for Registered, COD, and Express Mail, but Postal Money Orders are insured differently.

**Don't send cash through the mail** — it can't be insured. Buy money orders instead, available in amounts up to \$700. If a money order is lost or stolen, your customer receipt is all you need to have it replaced.

**BEGINNING JUNE 2, window-service at the Main Glenview Post Office, 1919 Prairie Street, will be extended on Mondays and Fridays from noon to 6:30pm, and on Saturdays from noon to 12:30pm.** Postmaster Stephan says the extended hours are in response to the needs of the community.

## More about the value of trees . . .

**IN ADDITION** to shading us and adding beauty, trees cut noise, help supply oxygen, keep the air fresh by digesting the carbon dioxide exhaled by people and emitted by engines, dilute other gaseous air pollutants, and collect dust, ashes and pollen in their hairy leaves.

**Trees are solar powered,** lowering air temperatures by using energy from the sun to evaporate the water in the leaves, thus increasing humidity in dry seasons. Their roots hold the soil in place, preventing erosion and helping air get beneath ground surface.

Leaves break the pelting of rain-drops and give soil a chance to soak

up as much water as possible. Fallen leaves help the soil retain moisture. When they decay, they replace minerals in the soil, enriching it.

**Trees increase property values,** supply pleasing patterns and shapes, fragrant blossoms, and seasonal displays of breathtaking color. They give birds a place to nest and sing, yield nuts, oils, gums, syrups, and fruits. Even when cut down, trees are valuable, supplying lumber for building, cellulose for paper, and mulch.

Joyce Kilmer knew what he was talking about. (But if God makes the trees, **we** are supposed to take care of them.)










