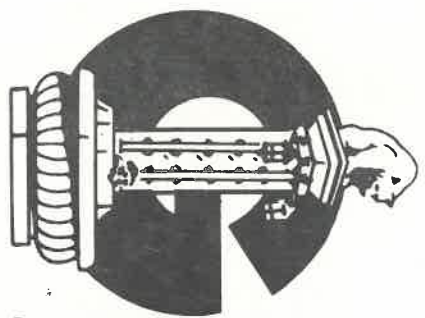

Fraud warning

From time to time we have warned about fraudulent practices in the north suburbs. Here are some you may not have heard about and should be prepared for:

THE TV, VCR, or MICROWAVE CON. The offender approaches the victim, usually in a shopping-center parking lot or other heavily traveled commercial area, and offers television sets/VCRs/microwave ovens at very low prices. The victim is taken to a vehicle and shown boxes in plastic shrink-wrap, with labels that look genuine. The price is paid, the offender leaves, and the victim discovers the box contains nothing but bricks.

THE CARGO SCAM. In a similar game, the offender approaches a group of factory/office employees, claiming to have a bargain truckload of TVs/VCRs/microwave ovens. The victims agree to buy the entire load, paying in advance. The cargo isn't delivered and the offender is never found.

THE EMERGENCY CON. A couple with children comes to the door and asks to use the phone because they have an emergency (car problems, sick child, bad directions) and must call for help. Once inside, one of them searches the house and pockets valuables while others distract the victim.

If you suspect someone has tried to victimize you, call the police. If you've already been defrauded, call the Glenview Police (729-5000) and report it. Don't be embarrassed — criminals count on you to keep quiet so they can go on working the community. Don't cooperate!

IN LAST MONTH'S ISSUE concerning home security, the text should have said that padlocks on window-well covers should be on the inside, to conform to fire-safety rules. (Thanks to the sharp-eyed reader who called.)

AN AUCTION OF UNCLAIMED ITEMS (35 bikes, T-tops, radar detectors, car radios, watches, jewelry, motorcycles, furniture, etc.) will take place Sat., Sept. 20, at the Police Department garage, 1215 Waukegan Rd. Doors open 9:30am for viewing; bidding begins at 10am.

TREES AND SHRUBBERY on private properties must not overhang sidewalks, streets or alleys, or cover traffic or street signs. Visual blockage is hazardous to motorists, cyclists and pedestrians. Private shrubs and low-hanging limbs must be trimmed back by property owners at least one foot from any public way. Shrubs and hedges at corner locations must not be higher than 36 inches from the ground. Please cooperate.

The honor was for her volunteer work with the Village Health Department in conducting weekly Slim and Trim classes September through May, since 1973.

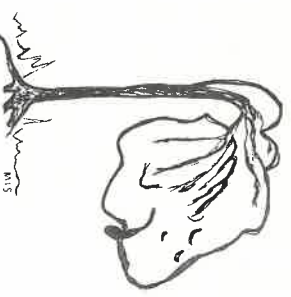

Water new parkway trees this fall

Because the new parkway trees represent a substantial investment of your tax dollars, please note the following formula, recommended by the Public Works Department, and follow it in case of insufficient rainfall:

At regular intervals (7 to 10 days recommended), give each new parkway tree adjacent to your property at least 6, but no more than 10, gallons of water. Gradual soaking for about half an hour with a very small stream from the hose is best, to avoid runoff and water wastage. Careful cultivation at the base with a hoe from time to time will help aerate the roots.

A NEW LAW PROTECTS THE ELDERLY from repair frauds. The statute closes loopholes that made it difficult in the past to prosecute home-repair-con artists. Conviction for intentionally damaging property in order to lure homeowners into repairs now carries a prison term of 1-3 years. Convictions for excessive overcharges carry prison sentences of 1-5 years. It is now a crime to give false promises or deceive an elderly customer, to lie about terms of a contract, and to impersonate a government or utility company inspector.

Parents of children going to school this year for the first time should point out homes and stores they can go to for help in an emergency.

Rehearse the child on the following: Full name, address, phone number (including area code), how to use public phones, and the number of the **Glenview Police, 729-5000**. Explain that calls to this number may be made at any time if help is needed.

Teach your child that police officers are friends. (Make sure the child knows what a Glenview police uniform looks like.)

If your child wears clothes or carries a lunch box with a name, explain that this is how strangers can pick it up. (Teach the child never to answer calls or greetings from strangers.)

Report missing children at once to the Glenview Police Department's emergency number, 724-2131.

MOTORISTS MUST ALWAYS COME TO A FULL STOP when approaching a stationary school bus headed in the same direction.
