

Elderly Housing Complex started

Glenview Elderly Housing Complex, which will be underway as soon as final clearance is received from Washington D.C. (possibly before you receive this newsletter), will be at the southeast corner of Glenview Road and Harlem Avenue.

To be built with the assistance of a \$4.55 million loan from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the complex will be managed by Evangelical Health Systems of Oak Brook, which maintain similar facilities in Downers Grove and Barrington.

Included will be 48 1-bedroom apartments, 23 efficiency units, 4 handicapped units, and 5 wheelchair models, each equipped with range and refrigerator. The building will also

have a community dining room, kitchen, atrium, and game and craft rooms.

Designed in conformance with the Illinois Capital Development Board's standards of accessibility, the residence will be adjacent to train and bus transportation, the Glenview Public Library, shopping facilities, and very close to the Glenview Fire Department paramedic service.

Construction work is by A. J. Maggio of Mt. Prospect, and is expected to be complete by this time next year.

Applications, rental costs, and criteria for eligibility are not yet available. Please watch future issues of this newsletter for further information.
