### Cablenet seeking student interns

### Tax and housing assistance offered to Glenview seniors

#### Tax Aide Feb. 1 - April 15

Seniors often pay more taxes than they owe because they can't afford expert tax preparers. Such overpayments need not occur. Glenview has the AARP free and convenient Tax Aide program.

The American Association of Retired Persons program offers free tax information and Tax Aides to fill out or checking federal and state income-tax forms — volunteers trained by the Internal Revenue Service.

Tax Aides will be available from February 1 through April 15 at four Glenview locations. Please telephone in advance for appointments.

**RESIDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE** for prompt removal of snow and ice from sidewalks adjacent to their homes. Make sure you have a serviceable snow shovel or blower and a supply of ice-melting compound on hand throughout the season. Remember that mail carriers, children and senior adults use the sidewalks every day during the winter months. Please make it safe for them to do so.

**DO NOT SHOVEL, BLOW OR PLOW SNOW** onto any part of a public street or sidewalk. Instruct those hired for snow removal that it is illegal in Glenview to cover or block a public thoroughfare with snow. Such blockage creates hazards for both pedestrians and motorists.

#### Financial aid filing by Mar. 1

Glenview residents 65 or older who pay either rent or real-estate taxes and have been village residents for at least two years, may qualify for financial help through the **Senior Housing Assistance Program**.

Gross annual income of applicants must not exceed \$10,000 for a single person or \$12,000 for a married couple. A limited number of seniors will be chosen on the basis of need.

Applications must be filed **on or before Friday, March 1**. All information will be held confidential.

Application forms are now available at the Village Hall (1225 Waukegan Road), the Senior Center (901 Shermer Road), the Public Library (1930 Glenview Road), and the Chamber of Commerce (2320 Glenview Road).

A READER who is also a plumber has advice for householders going on vacation: **Leave thermostats no lower than 68 degrees, and don't turn off the water unless the house has hot-water heat.** Frozen and burst pipes could cause damage more expensive than leaving the heat on.

**GLASS BLOCKS COVERING WATER METERS** should be insulated during periods of extreme cold, as freezing will crack blocks and damage meters. (Don't worry about readability — water use will be estimated and adjustments made in the spring.)

## Recent action of Glenview trustees

Adopted the 1985 municipal budget, totalling \$15,446,668. . . . Accepted the insurance proposal of Arthur J. Gallagher (\$175,221), covering all village property and employees. . . . Authorized purchase of 7 replacement squad cars from Wilshire Ford of Wilmette (\$83,503). . . . Approved purchase of self-contained breathing equipment for firefighters from Glazebrook Fire Equipment (\$3,950). . . . Authorized signalization for the south end of River Drive (at Dewes Street and Waukegan Road) for spring installation. . . . Approved village participation in the state purchasing program for printing equipment (one A. B. Dick #385 press and cutter). . . . Adopted three tax abatements on corporate-purpose bond series: 1976 (\$385,000); 1977 (\$4,525,000); and 1979 (\$5,700,000). . . . Authorized sale of village-owned real estate (former pump-station site) at Linneman Street and Wedell Lane for \$20,000. . . . Authorized agreements for installation of a 16-inch water main along Milwaukee Avenue south of Countryside Lane, and a 6-inch main in a public utility easement, to serve a small warehouse on Milwaukee Avenue. . . . Approved renewal of an entertainment license for a restaurant at 630 Waukegan Road. . . . Granted permission for an event at OLPH Church on April 27 involving games of chance. . . . Amended the water-supply agreement with Citizens' Utilities to extend the dates. . . . Accepted an easement for a sanitary sewer on rear lot lines between Gladish and Park Lanes. . . . Swore in a new Library Director, Marcia Dillon, appointed to fill an unexpired term until the April 2 election. . . . Glenkirk announces an educational seminar on small group homes for the developmentally handicapped on Monday, January 21, 5:30 to 7:30pm, at Glenkirk School, Alden and Clay Courts, Deerfield.

Purpose of the seminar is to provide background and educational resources to area press and legislators on housing and other barriers confronting mentally handicapped persons.

Speakers include Rep. David Hollister (D) of Michigan, sponsor of a state-wide zoning bill; Tom Miller, Macomb Oakland Regional Center (Wayne County) development director; and Alan G. Spector, Glenkirk's executive director, director of Child Care Associates of Illinois, and chairman of the Illinois Conference of Executives.

**NORTRAN RIDERSHIP** has increased during 1984, nearly 8% over 1983 (nationwide the increase is only about 4%). Totals have finally exceeded those set during the 1982 commuter rail strike. ## State law changed for 4-lane roads re stopped buses

The state law that says motorists must come to a full stop when approaching a stationary school bus has recently been changed slightly, but the change can make a BIG difference to your safety as a driver.

**On 4-lane roads** (like Lake and Willow) **traffic from the opposite direction does not stop**, but traffic in both lanes **behind the bus must always stop**. **On 2-lane roads** motorists approaching the bus **from both directions must stop**.

School-bus schedules are now arranged so that children are discharged only on the side on which they live, and therefore never need to cross 4-lane roads on foot.

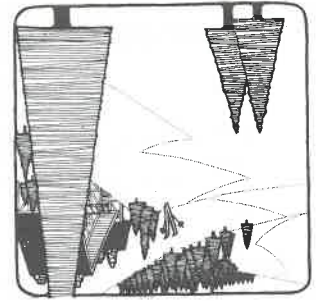
