Village, Finance Director receive honors

The Government Finance Officers Association of the U.S. and Canada has recently given its **Certificate of Conformance in Financial Reporting for 1983** to the Village of Glenview.

Glenview also received the certificate, the highest form of recognition for governmental accounting and financial reporting in North America, for 1982. Entries are judged by impartial finance officers, CPAs, educators and other financial experts.

When a certificate is given, a **Financial Reporting Achievement Award** is presented to the person responsible for the government's accounting and reporting procedures. **Dennis M. Lauer, Glenview's Finance Director**, has therefore received the award for the second time.

We congratulate Lauer and his competent staff for their continuing excellence in professional practice, and for bringing Glenview into the winners' circle once more.

Inadequate snow plowing Not our fault

Angry callers besieged the Village Hall during the recent major snowfall, assuming that inadequate plowing on certain roadways was the fault of the Village of Glenview.

The following are the responsibility of Cook County — Glenview is not allowed to service them: **East Lake Avenue, Harms Road, Landwehr Road, Lehigh Avenue, Sunset Ridge Road, Wagner Road, and Winnetka Road.**

The following are the responsibility of the Illinois Department of Transportation, not the village: **Central Road, Dearlove Road, Golf Road, Greenwood Road, Milwaukee Avenue, Pflingsten Road, and Willow Road.**

Village officials are concerned about the poor service, and have set up meetings with the other agencies to ensure better future cooperation.

School caucus seeks candidates

The screening committee of the Consolidated Elementary School District 34 Caucus is accepting applications and suggestions from residents interested in running for the District 34 School Board.

Police warning

Illinois law prohibits the wearing of Walkman or Walkman-type headset receivers while driving or cycling.

Police have recently stopped headset-wearing drivers who were unaware they were violating a state law.

The reason for the law should be obvious: **Headsets block out all other sounds. Awareness of traffic sounds is essential for safe driving.**

Police also urge joggers to refrain from wearing headsets, as they block out sirens, horns, whistles and other signals of impending danger.
