## LOCAL ELECTION TUES., APRIL 2

The election on Tuesday, April 2, is for village, library and park officials. To be elected:

### VILLAGE BOARD

- 1 President (4-year term)
- 1 Clerk (4-year term)
- 3 Trustees (4-year terms)

### LIBRARY BOARD

- 4 Directors (4-year terms)
- 1 Director (2-year term, to fill a vacancy)

### PARK BOARD

- 2 Commissioners (6-year terms)

**TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS** will also be elected on April 2. Call your township office for details: Maine (297-2510), New Trier (446-8202), Niles (673-9300), Northfield (724-8300).

Polls will be open from 6am to 7pm at the same places used for voting at the November presidential election.

If you will be absent from Cook County on Tuesday, April 2, please read and follow the procedure for **absentee voting** (column 3 at right).



**THE NO-STREET-PARKING BAN** lasts through the month of March. Cars must not be left on any Glenview street between 2 and 6am. (Illegally parked vehicles may be towed away.)

### A CANDIDATE FORUM

All candidates on the April 2 ballot have been invited to attend. The public is urged to participate by asking questions.

**"THE GREAT NEIGH-BEAR-HOOD FESTIVAL"** is the theme of this year's Independence Day celebration on (you guessed it) Thursday, July 4. This is the 20th annual fete planned by the local celebration committee, and will include a morning parade, afternoon food festival and carnival games, and entertainment and fireworks at night. **DISTRICT 34** holds kindergarten registration Thursday, March 21, at the following elementary schools: Henking (998-5035), Lyon (998-5045), and Westbrook (998-5055). Children must be five years old on or before December 1 of this year, or have qualified for early enrollment through screening procedures. For more information call one of the schools listed above.

Registered voters who will be absent from Cook County on April 2 may vote by absentee ballot.

By mail it is a two-step process:

1- Obtain an application now (from the Village Hall, Northfield Township or the County Clerk), complete the form and return it to the County Clerk by Thursday, March 28. A ballot will be sent to the address requested.

2- Mail the marked ballot back to the County Clerk to reach him no later than Monday, April 1.

**In-person absentee voting** will be open weekdays at the Village Hall, Northfield Township, and the County Clerk's office (118 North Clark St., Chicago, 4th floor) through Monday, April 1, during regular office hours (9am-5pm).

The County Clerk's office and the Northfield Township office are also open from 9am to noon **Saturdays** for absentee voting. (The Village Hall is closed Saturdays.)

**APPLICATIONS FOR SENIOR HOUSING RESIDENCY** will not be available until construction of the senior-housing complex at Glenview Road and Harlem Avenue is at least three-quarters complete.

As the construction has not yet begun, it will be some time before the application process can begin.

Information as to how to apply will be published in this Newsletter when application forms become available.

**FREE BLOOD-PRESSURE CHECKS** are offered every Thursday, 11am-noon.

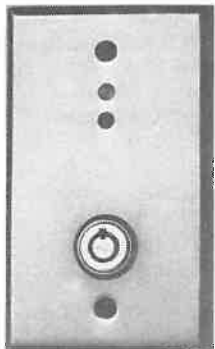

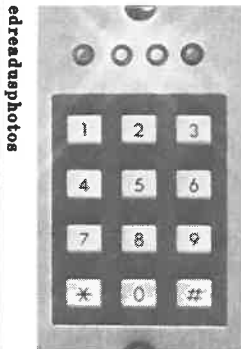

## WARNING:

**ALARM SYSTEMS** in both businesses and private homes are being bypassed on the North Shore by a simple method with common tools. (We aren't educating the burglars — they already know. But maybe you don't.)



**WRONG: Alarm-system tubular keyway**, which can be sprayed with glue or lacquer, or picked to prevent activation of the alarm. Such a keyway should be replaced with a digital keypad (shown at right) or a high-security cylinder with tamper-proof switch to activate if a burglar tries to bypass or turn off.



**RIGHT: Digital keypad.** Consult your alarm service for hardware like this to fortify an alarm system against burglary. Remember, **THERE IS NO SECURITY AT ALL** if your alarm system can easily be bypassed or turned off.

**CIRCUIT BREAKER GRANTS** can now be exchanged for participation in the Health and Hypertension Pharmaceutical Assistance Program. The \$80 additional tax-relief grant will buy a year's supply of angina medicine worth \$600, or a year's supply of hypertension medicine worth \$235. (Any cardiovascular agent or drug is covered under the program.) The option is incorporated in the 1984 Circuit-Breaker form.

**PULMONARY SCREENING**, part of Glenbrook Hospital's free HealthWatch series, will be conducted Saturday, March 23, 10am-3pm, for evaluation of lung function and early detection of problems like emphysema and asthma. For details call 729-8800, X 115.

**SENIORS CAN EARN** as much money as they want and still receive full Social Security benefits, beginning the month in which they turn 70.

**HANDICAPPED PARKING CARDS** are now available from the Secretary of State's Senior Citizen Division, offering handicapped parking privileges to more of the disabled than did local authorities, including the blind, those with respiratory problems, and those who walk with braces. ## Four receive civic awards

**Dr. William H. Schreiner**, principal of Glenbrook South High School, received the Citizen of 1984 Award for improving school programs and student achievement, and contributing to local cultural and environmental wellbeing.

**Kristine Goetz**, a Glenbrook South senior, received the 1984 Youth Award for scholastic excellence and achievements in extracurricular activities, sports and church affairs.

**Officer Charles Wolavka** was the driving force in investigation of two murders (one solved), and the investigation and solution of a rape case, a burglary, and some 50 separate cases of criminal damage, earning him the Public Safety Award.

**Paul Sierzega**, an employee of the Park District, discovered a knife-wielding prowler at the home of the director of The Grove, noted the license number, and made possible the offender's subsequent arrest and sentencing. He received the Public Service Award.

The awards were made by local service organizations at the annual Civic Awards banquet on March 7.

## Tax-Aide essential this year

**Seniors** will do well this year to use the free tax service offered by Tax-Aide, the AARP program that helps those over 55 fill out federal and state tax forms. The help is available through April 15.

This year, for the first time, certain Social Security and Tier 1 railroad retirement benefits are subject to taxation. Beneficiaries have been mailed Form 1099 (similar to forms sent by banks to tell how much interest has been earned).

The disability income exclusion has been repealed, and there is a new tax credit, filed under Schedule R, for anyone under 65 who is totally and permanently disabled.

These and other tax matters can be confusing, but will be readily explained by the Free AARP Tax-Aide counselor, who has been trained by the IRS.

**Accepted the bid** of Glenview Elderly Housing, Inc., a nonprofit organization composed of Evangelical Health Systems members and Glenview residents (\$375,000), for the property at the southeast corner of Glenview Road and Harlem Avenue (on which the senior-housing complex will be built), per HUD requirement. . . . **Approved an agreement** with Harza Engineering, Chicago (\$76,050), for the first stage of storm-water management from east Glenview Road to the east Glenview boundary, to be completed this fall. . . . **Renewed the Glenview lease** on railroad property along Railroad Avenue between Linneman and Dewes Streets, at \$1,800/year for 3 years. . . . **Annexed** a one-lot subdivision at 1035 Queen's Lane. . . . **Amended** the alcoholic beverage code to allow Class C and G wine tastings on a calendar-year basis. . . . **Granted conditional use** for 2111 Chestnut for auto repair activity in an industrial zone. . . . **Authorized purchases:** A Glazebrook aerial truck (\$337,485) for Fire Department use, to replace a 24-year-old model to be sold, from Pierce Manufacturing of Appleton, Wisconsin; one folding machine for the Fire Department print shop (\$6,200) from Tompkins Printing Equipment; a one-ton dump truck (\$13,418) and six one-ton pickup trucks (\$81,828) from
