### CABLE CUSTOMERS PLEASE NOTE:

Hours for Cablenet Customer Service (498-9213) are 9am-1:30pm and 2:30-5:30pm Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Thursday hours run to 7:30pm. Saturday hours are 8:30am-2pm. The office is closed Mondays.

Cablenet 24-hour Repair Service (299-9275) is for technical problems such as no picture, faulty reception, etc.

RESIDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE for prompt removal of snow and ice from sidewalks adjacent to their homes. Make sure you have a serviceable snow shovel or blower and a supply of ice-melting compound on hand throughout the season. Remember that mail carriers, children and senior adults use the sidewalks every day during the winter months. Please make it safe for them to do so.

**WATER-MAIN BREAKS** should be reported as soon as discovered to either the Village Hall (724-1700) or the Police Department (729-5000).

## January 21 filing deadline Local election coming in spring

Clenview residents interested in running for openings on the Village Board, the Library Board or the Park Board should begin now to collect the necessary documents: (1) Statements of Candidacy, (2) Statements of Economic Interests, and (3) Nominating Petitions.

The final date for filing is Monday, January 21, 1985. The election will be held Tuesday, April 2, 1985.

Call the County Clerk (443-8720) and ask for the Statement of Economic Interest form to be mailed to you. Complete and return it promptly and a receipt will be mailed back.

Meantime, buy petition forms (at stationery or office-supply stores) and collect signatures of local residents who are registered voters. (Those who circulate the petitions must also be local registered voters.)

### Number of signatures required:

For a Village Board office, a party candidate must have no fewer signatures of registered voters than 5% of the number of ballots cast at the last village election (1442), or no fewer than 73. An independent candidate must have at least 5% (or no fewer than 73), but no more than 8% (or 116).

For a Library Board office, a candidate needs the signatures of only 50 registered voters.

For a Park Board office, a candidate must have no fewer signatures of registered voters than 2% of the number of ballots cast at the last village election (1442), or at least 29.

Present the receipt for the Economic Interests Statement, the Statement of Candidacy, and the completed petition forms to the Village Clerk at the Glenview Village Hall, 1225 Waukegan Road, between January 14 and 21. For more information call the Cook County Election Board (443-5150) or the Illinois Board of Elections (793-6440).

SUPERVISED OUTDOOR ICE SKATING AND SLEDDING will be offered by the Park District all winter, as weather permits. Ice rinks will be in Cunliff, Elm, Flick and Roosevelt Parks. Sledding hills, equipped with permanent tobaggan chutes, are in Elm and Flick Parks. Hours are 4-8pm weekdays, 1-8pm weekends and school holidays.

Thieves know that expensive new merchandise is around at this time of the year, and they intend to get all of it they can — at your expense.

THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF COR-RECTIONS has made an annual inspection of Glenview's municipal jail and found it to be in compliance with state standards. A 50% REDUCTION IN FEES for state license plates will be offered in January to elderly and disabled drivers who qualify for the Circuit-Breaker Grant. The Secretary of State will mail discount registration cards to all Circuit-Breaker grantees, who must then submit the cards with their auto license applications. (Each grantee will be entitled to one discount per year on state license plates as of January, 1985.)

REGISTRATION FOR WINTER PROGRAMS is open at the Park District office, 1930 Prairie Street, as of Dec. 12. See the Fall/Winter Brochure for complete information.

THE PARK DISTRICT'S HOLIDAY WORKSHOP for grades 1-6 will be open at the Glenview Ice Center Saturday, Dec. 22, 9am-4:30pm, to make gifts and decorations. Costs are from 25¢ to \$2, depending upon project selected. No registration required — just drop in.

SUPERVISED OPEN GYM for grade 3 through adult will be held by the Park District Dec. 26-28 and January 2-4. Grades 3-8 may attend at Glen Grove School from noon to 4pm. High schoolers and adults may attend at Springman Junior High from 8am to 4pm. The programs are free and sponsored by the Park District.

CROSS-COUNTRY SKI CLINICS will be held by the Park District at the Glenview Park Golf Club every Saturday and Sunday from January 5 through February 10. Cost is \$5 per session for those with equipment, or \$10 with including rental equipment. Sign up at the Park District office by 5pm the Wednesday before the session to be attended.

# Seniors may qualify for housing aid

Clenview residents 65 or older who pay either rent or real-estate taxes and have been village residents for at least two years, may qualify for financial help through the Senior Housing Assistance Program.

Gross annual income of applicants must not exceed \$10,000 for a single person or \$12,000 for a married couple. A limited number of seniors will be chosen on the basis of need.

Those eligible may obtain application forms beginning Wednesday, January 2. Applications must be filed on or before Friday, March 1. All information will be held confidential.

Application forms will be available at the Glenview Village Hall (1225 Waukegan Road), the Glenview Senior Center (901 Shermer Road), the Glenview Public Library (1930 Glenview Road), and the Glenview Chamber of Commerce (2320 Glenview Road). 

## Recent Village Board action

Approved recapture of expense of installation of water main on Brookdale Lane (south of Willow Road from Landwehr Road west to a dead end). Nine property owners will pay equal shares of the \$28,709 cost. . . . Agreed to a partnership between Cablenet and Telecommunications, Inc., to be known as Cablenet Associates. . . . Approved an addition to the agreement for improvements of Glenview Road. . . . Adjusted license fees for coin-operated laundries from per-machine to per-facility, to an annual rate of \$150. . . . Approved conditional use for automotive

repairs at 2001 and 2019 Johns Drive, both in I-1 light-industry zone. . . . Approved involuntary annexation of 3100 Shermer Road (Sunset Memorial Cemetery, fewer than 60 acres). . . . Prohibited parking on both sides of Spruce Drive between Lehigh Avenue and Swainwood Drive, from 8 to 10am Mondays through Fridays. . . . Renewed winter service and financial agreements with the Village of Golf (for Glenview's salting of Overlook Drive and Golf intersections after Glenview's own thoroughfares have been salted).

GLENBROOK SOUTH MARCHING BAND DAY has been proclaimed by the Village President for Saturday, December 29, when the band will be one of two from Illinois participating in the Fiesta Bowl parade in Phoenix. (The parade will be seen on WGN-TV, Channel 9.) The Glenbrook South band is the only one from Illinois that will have marched in all four major bowl parades — Rose Bowl, Cotton Bowl, Orange Bowl and Fiesta Bowl.

HOLIDAY HAZARDS for children and pets include mistletoe, holly, pine needles, poinsettia plants, and metal icicles. Ingesting them causes vomiting, stomach and intestinal pain, and possible serious complications. Keep holiday plants and decorations away from children and pets!

GLASS BLOCKS COVERING WATER METERS should be insulated during periods of extreme cold, as freezing will crack blocks and damage meters. (Don't worry about readability — water use will be estimated and adjustments made in the spring.)
