GLENVIEW HAS A LEASH LAW for dogs that mandates the wearing of a collar and leash (with human being attached) whenever a canine is not on the property of its owner.

The law also requires the person walking the dog to carry the means for immediate removal of animal feces from where they are dropped to the property of the owner for proper disposal. A "pooper scooper" and a self-sealing plastic bag are good dog-walking accouterments. (Some pet owners use two plastic bags, one worn over the hand as a picker-upper.)

Whatever the means, the end is the same: You must pick up the dog droppings on the spot and carry them home to your own garbage pail or toilet.

Remember that leash and pooper-scooper laws are in effect 365 days a year.

BOTH DOGS AND CATS must now be wearing their 1982 Glenview license tags. If your animals' credentials are not up to date, please take care of the matter as soon as possible -- for the health and safety of the animals.

When you come to the Village Hall for pet licenses, please bring a **current** rabies certificate for each animal, and a veterinarian's statement of neutering for each altered pet. (Licenses for altered animals cost less.)



Flood victims: Loans and tax deductions are available

Property owners (of homes as well as businesses) in Northfield and New Trier Townships are eligible for loans from the Small Business Administration for repairs of damage caused by the July flood.

They may also claim **itemized flood-related loss of personal property and structural damage to buildings** as tax liabilities by filing IRS Form 4684, copies of which are available from the Northfield Township Office, 3801 West Lake Avenue, Glenview.

It would be advisable for claimants to add photographs of flood damage as supporting documents to form 4684.

ANY PROPERTY OWNER WHOSE BASEMENT WAS FLOODED should have the furnace burner serviced by an expert furnace-repair company before using any heat this fall. Last chances for voter registration before the upcoming election

Voter registration is open Monday through Friday, 9am to 5pm, at the Village Hall. Voter registration is also open Monday through Friday, 9am to 5pm, and Saturday, 9 to noon, at the Northfield Township office, 3801 West Lake Avenue, and the County Clerk's office in Chicago. **The last day to register at any of these three offices is Monday, September 27.**

The final opportunity will be at PRECINCT REGISTRATION, to be held in polling places throughout the village on **Tuesday, October 5, 8am to 9pm.**

ELECTION DAY IS TUESDAY,
NOVEMBER 2.

Registered voters who have moved since the last election (the primary on Tuesday, March 16), or who will have moved by the upcoming election day, **must notify the County Clerk of their new addresses before September 27,** or they will not be allowed to vote.

Voters who have moved into Glenview from Chicago or from anywhere outside Cook County must reregister.

Cook County will conduct the official canvass of voters on October 6 and 7, to verify names on polling sheets for each precinct and remove names of absent or deceased persons from voting rolls.

Annual Folk Fest set for October 3



CELEBRATE THE HERITAGE OF GLENVIEW and join the fun by attending the fourth annual **GROVE FOLK FEST** on Sunday, October 3, from noon to 5pm.

An assortment of pioneer foods — hunter's stew, corn-on-the-cob, home-baked bread with honey butter, honeyed apples, cider, doughnuts and coffee — will be available on the grounds, as will lemonade and hot dogs for the youngsters.

Pioneer skills will be demonstrated throughout the afternoon, and there will be storytelling, folk music, square dancing, and an original playlet. Dozens of arts and crafts will be exhibited, with many items offered for sale.

The Grove, located on the east side of Milwaukee Avenue in Glenview, is a National Historic Landmark. The Glenview Park District, which sponsors the annual Folk Fest, cordially invites you to attend this proud event.

During the month of August The Glenview Trustees . . .

¶ Set the 1982 tax levy. (See chart on page 1.)

¶ Designated four used village vehicles to be sold at the Northwest Municipal Conference's annual auction on September 25 in Evanston. (See back page for announcement.)

¶ Accepted the bid of A.A. Electric Company of Cicero (\$97,331) for traffic signals at shopping center driveways on Waukegan Road north of Lake Avenue. Owners of the shopping centers will pay \$23,172.50, and the remaining \$74,158.50 will be appropriated from local Motor Fuel Tax funds.

¶ Accepted the bid of Klehm Bros. of Arlington Heights (\$10,028,75) for trees for the annual 50-50 tree-planting program.

¶ Rezoned 1313 Shermer Road for public use (for the new Public Works Service Center).

¶ Rezoned 10320 Dearlove Road from R-18 (multifamily housing) to I-2 (industry), making the front half of the required masonry wall on the south

boundary of adjoining property (4300-46 Di Paola Center) unnecessary.

¶ Amended the zoning ordinance to bring the definition of day-care homes into conformance with state statutes.

¶ Approved the resubdivision and rezoning (R-3 to R-4) of two lots at 2881 and 2895 Fredric Court.

¶ Annexed one lot at 3335 Potter Road, zoning it R-1.

¶ Added a previously vacated easement to a lot at 1941 Sunset Ridge Road.

¶ Authorized a two-hour closing of a fire lane at Plaza del Prado shopping center on October 2 for a gymnastics exhibition. (See item elsewhere on this page.)

¶ Authorized the closing of Glenview Road between Elm Street and Waukegan Road on Saturday, October 9, 10:15 to 11:15am, for the Glenbrook South homecoming parade. (Traffic will be rerouted to Spruce and Dewes Streets.)

colored clothing during daylight hours. If you run after dark, wear reflective material of some kind so motorists can see you.

MOTORISTS' ALERT: You must respect joggers' rights to be pedestrians, yield to them at crosswalks, and exercise caution when approaching them on shoulders of roadways.

JOGGERS' ALERT: You must use sidewalks wherever they exist, as mandated by state law. Where no sidewalk exists, the law says you may use the shoulder of the roadway, as long as you run on the left-hand side (against traffic). You must observe traffic signals. Stop and run in place if the light is red. Start running ahead when the light turns green.

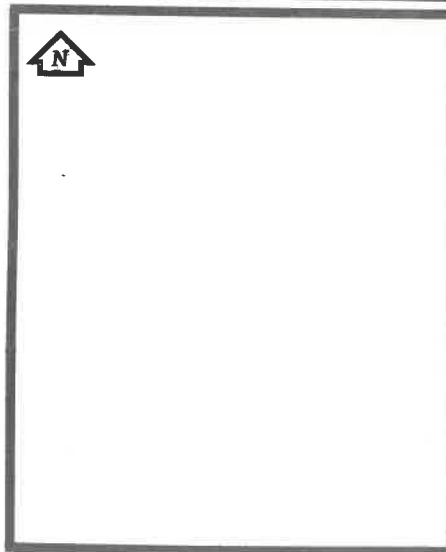
