### Volunteers needed for SPRING SAFETY PROJECTS

The Glenview area Safety Council needs volunteers to help with two important spring projects — choke-saving instruction for restaurant employees and others who may be interested, and the annual Bicycle Safety Program.

Dates for choke-saving instruction, which will be co-sponsored by the American Heart Association, have not yet been set. They will be announced within the next few weeks.

The Bicycle Safety Program will be held on Saturday, May 20, at three different sites to which residents may bring bikes for safety inspection and receive literature and other items. Volunteers will work about six hours that day. (Last year's program involved some 400 bicycles.)

### FREE BLOOD-PRESSURE CHECKS offered by Fire Department

You can have your blood pressure checked free of charge by going to the Fire Station, 1815 Glenview Road, any day (including Saturdays and Sundays) between 10 AM and 6 PM. Please enter the building by the front door.

High blood pressure, which usually produces no symptoms and therefore can go unnoticed by its victims, is the leading cause of stroke, congestive heart failure and kidney disease. Many a victim's family has mourned, too late, "If only we had known ..."

Now you CAN know, in time to get proper treatment and prevent sudden catastrophe. The test is painless and takes no more than five minutes of your time. No advance appointment is necessary. (Please wear loose-fitting sleeves, as the testing device wraps around your bare upper arm.)

**FREE BABYSITTER ORIENTATION**

Young people age 12 and older who would like to be trained as babysitters may attend the Glenview Fire Department's Babysitter Orientation five-session courses this spring. Those who complete five sessions will receive a wallet card and an attractive certificate suitable for framing.

The next available course meets February 16, 23, March 2, 9 and 16, 7 to 8:30 PM, in the Fire Department's classroom on the second floor of the Fire Station.

Because of classroom space limitations, only 45 people can be enrolled for one course, so the sooner you register the better chance you have of being enrolled in this February-March series.

In the event that enrollment is complete by the time your registration form is received, you will be eligible for one of TWO MORE identical courses to be offered between March and the end of the school year.

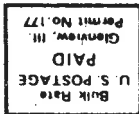

THE GLENVIEW TRUSTEES ...

- Adopted a written annexation policy. (Interested residents may obtain copies at the Village Hall.) Out-of-town applicants for connection to our water system must petition for annexation, and if annexation is impossible, the petition must be accompanied by a covenant running with the land, binding successive owners and interested parties to annexation whenever contiguity may occur.
- Authorized the same municipal control over the water system outside Village limits as within the Village, as to inspection of water-main construction and recapture of costs of construction.
- Granted conditional uses of properties in Plaza del Prado (at the southeast corner of Pfingsten and Willow Roads) for a cafeteria and a carry-out food operation.
- Authorized establishment of the budgeted position of Administrative Assistant to the Fire Chief.
- Directed the Village Manager to consider the Glenview Historical Society's request (for \$15,000 for its library facility) when preparing the 1978-79 fiscal year budget.
- Directed the Village Hall staff to prepare an ordinance to change the schedule of the sale of Village vehicle stickers to conform to the new State licensing schedule. (In November of 1978 the Village will sell a 6-month vehicle sticker, at half price, and in May of 1979 will begin selling 12-month stickers. The first 12-month sticker on the new schedule will be good from July 1, 1979, through June of 1980.
- Approved rephrasing of the requirement of proof-of-age for senior citizens purchasing vehicle license stickers at reduced prices. They may now present not only drivers' licenses, but (in cases where the car owner does not do the driving and therefore has no license) also other valid proof-of-age documents such as birth certificates or Medicare cards.
