### CARE OF NEW PARKWAY TREES

If you are one of the many residents who took advantage of the 50-50 Parkway Tree Program this year, you may be wondering what you can do to start your new tree on a vigorous, healthy life.

If you haven't watered the tree yet, do so immediately, but only once before winter sets in. The water will help to settle the soil around the ball of the tree.

Do not fertilize your tree the first year, as it was planted with a supply of fertilizer in the ball. Do not remove the wrapping until at least next spring, as it protects the bark from wind and sun. Leave the soil loose around the base, and be sure to water the tree next summer during the dry season.



The contractor is required to give us a one-year guarantee on all trees, so if yours doesn't leaf out by midsummer, give Public Works a call (724-1700) so that it can be replaced if necessary.

### DISPOSABLE IS NOT FLUSHABLE

The Public Works Department cleans every sewer line in Glenview on a regular annual schedule, but recently there has been a marked increase in sewer obstructions caused by disposable diapers and facial tissue.

Householders should be aware that, unlike toilet tissue, other paper products have a wet strength that causes them to pack together and block the sewer.

PLEASE — don't flush anything but toilet tissue into the sewer!

### A GENTLE REMINDER

In Glenview, garbage is one thing, and yard debris is another. They must be handled in two different ways:

**GARBAGE** (all household waste materials) must be stored in the approved containers and put out for collection near the service door, but NEVER on the parkway or other public property. The idea is that, once the containers are emptied, they are not out in plain view of neighbors and visitors, or rolling around on public property. That sort of appearance is not what we all want in Glenview.

**YARD REFUSE** is different. DO leave it on the parkway, but either in disposable containers, or tied into convenient bundles (2 by 4 feet and 60 pounds or less). That way, after the pickup, there is nothing left to clutter the landscape.

Please put both garbage and yard debris out NO EARLIER THAN 7 PM the night before collection. Your cooperation is needed to keep Glenview beautiful.

During the month of October  
**THE GLENVIEW TRUSTEES ...**

- Completed the purchase of the Northfield Woods Water System. Customer billing will be done on a quarterly basis, and the first billing, for the months of October, November and December, will be received by customers the first week in January. PLEASE NOTE: ALL water bills are now payable AT THE VILLAGE HALL. Bills paid after the due date must include the gross amount. Illinois Municipal Water Company's former customers will receive bills on the same schedule as before.
- Authorized filing a petition for modification in the matter of Lake Michigan water allocation. Petition will be filed with the Illinois Department of Transportation (Water Resources Division).
- Accepted the official canvass of the October 15 annexation referendum (231 homes in Belwood and Glenview Civic Estates Subdivisions): 251 in favor of annexation, 81 against. A court order on October 19 formally annexed the properties to the Village.
- Approved the annexation agreement with owners of 2995 Willow Road (5 acres).
- Rezoned 3055 Willow Road (2½ acres) from R-1 to R-3 (both residential).
- Amended the plumbing code, as required by the State, to require water-saving fixtures (toilet tanks, shower heads, etc.) in all new construction, and amended the municipal code to conform to the water-saving fixtures requirement for all new construction on our water systems, whether properties served are either within or outside of Village boundaries.
- Increased Class G liquor licenses by one, to accommodate sale of package goods by a pharmacy at the southeast corner of Willow and Pfingsten Roads.
- Accepted the bid of General Electric of Park Ridge (\$4,648) for 8 radio units to be installed in vehicles as follows: 1 for the Village Sanitarian, 1 for the Building Department, 2 for Public Works and 4 for the Water Department.
- Amended Village Board Meeting rules of procedure, and amended the Comprehensive Plan with respect to the official map.
- Dissolved the Bicentennial Commission.

The Illinois Department of Transportation has awarded a contract to Contract and Materials Company (low bidder at \$63,710)

WATCH THE BIRDIE!



The Glenview Health Department reminds you that poultry is likely to be high in salmonella bacteria, so precautions must be taken when handling the Thanksgiving dinner main course.

Frozen turkeys should be carefully thawed: in the refrigerator, according to the directions printed on the wrapper, at room temperature while double-wrapped in brown paper and for no longer than one hour per pound, or in a microwave oven.

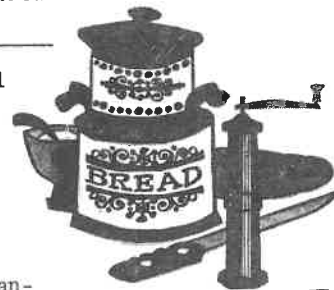
Don't stuff your turkey until just before roasting. Warm stuffing left in a bird for any length of time will cause rapid bacteria growth.

Cook to an internal temperature for both meat and dressing of at least 165°F. After cooking, be sure meat and dressing do not stand at room temperature for any length of time. Refrigerate promptly after every meal. When reheating leftovers, do it quickly to at least 165°F.

If you follow these precautions you will enjoy not only the Thanksgiving meal, but the rest of the Thanksgiving weekend!

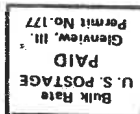
