CANNING AND FREEZING Your Garden Produce is a free program lasting about an hour on Thursday, June 3, 1 PM, in the Maynard Room of the Glenview Public Library. It will be conducted

by a representative of the University of Illinois Cooperative Extension Service.

THE FIRST TWO YEARS in the life of your 50-50 parkway tree are critical ones. Take care of the tree by mulching around the trunk (or cultivating frequently) to prevent weed growth. Remove sucker growth at the bottom of the trunk. Also — *it is VERY IMPORTANT to REMOVE THE TWINE FROM THE WRAPPING after the first growing season.* The twine prevents growth of the trunk and causes "girdling," which will kill a young tree. (Don't worry about the wrapping material — it will fall off by itself in about two years, and in the meantime is actually beneficial. It's the TWINE that kills the tree, after the first growing season.)

"LET'S LOOK AT LONDON" with Billie Lundberg on Wednesday, June 9, in the Glenview Public Library Maynard Room, at 7:30 PM. Admission is free. A BICENTENNIAL CHALLENGE Game for young people in grades 7-9, begins with registration on Saturday, June 12, at the Adult Services Desk of the Glenview Public Library. Seven separate quizzes will be available, and you can finish the set at your own pace. Prizes include books, records, and cassette tapes.

THE GLENVIEW TRUSTEES ...

- Rezoned the southeast corner of Washington Street and Glenview Road to public-land status, to allow its use for additional Library parking.
- Annexed four surrounded lots west of Pffingsten Road and south of Lake Avenue (in Woodland Grove Subdivision).
- Annexed vacant property at 3620 Glenview Road, owned by School District Number 34.
- Authorized the transfer of old special-assessment funds to the corporate fund, and laid out the necessary procedure for so doing.
- Authorized the sale of real estate in the rear of 1245 Waukegan Road, to enable exchange of property with the owner of abutting land.
- Increased the number of waste-disposal service licenses from nine to ten, to include Ace Disposal Company.
- Amended the Village Code to allow Village employees to have access to all water meters.
- Approved Owens Glenoak Acres Resubdivision, two lots at 1737 Ridgewood Drive.
- Filed a legal objection with Cook County to a petition to rezone 6.3 acres (unincorporated) at the northeast corner of Pffingsten Road and Willow Road, from residential to commercial use.
- Filed a legal objection with Cook County to a petition to rezone a fraction of an acre (unincorporated) on commercial property at the south side of Jefferson Avenue 225 feet east of Monroe Avenue, for use as a parking lot.

IN AN EFFORT TO REDUCE VILLAGE EXPENSES, a different method of distribution will be used for future issues of the Village Newsletter.
