Some information about
THE FLOOD PLAIN
and its problems:



If you live along or near the river, you are probably in the flood plain. As you know, heavy rains cause the river to spill over its banks, flooding yards, basements, storm sewers, and streets.

The Techny retention basin, now being designed, and expected to be completed in 1980, will eliminate such problems, but in the interim both the Village and the State require that any building or regrading of lots be done in such a way as not to add to the flood problem.

Owners of property along the river bank are responsible for maintaining their own portions of the bank, but should be aware that any construction requires a permit, and any lot filling, retaining wall, or bank stabilization work requires Village approval before such a permit is issued.

If you live anywhere in the flood plain and plan any work on your property (construction or filling), you can get further information from the Building and Zoning Department at the Village Hall. The Village permit must be obtained first, and the State permit requires a joint process by Village and State.

THE GLENVIEW TRUSTEES ...

- Denied request for Maclean Court cul-de-sac, and referred to the Village staff the need for improvement in parking and traffic on Maclean and Hutchings.
- Approved the southeast corner of Washington Street and Glenview Road for conditional use as a Library parking lot.
- Approved the sale of \$200,000 in bonds for purchase of the above lot and improving it for parking use.
- Reappointed: Attorney Ford, Fire and Police Commissioner Thomas, Forestry Commissioners Stevens, Brickman, and Alan, and Police Pension Board Member Martorano.
- Denied a petition to rezone (R1 to R4) 14 acres south of Lawson Road.
- Approved Cedar Grove Subdivision, 1725-35 Grove St.
- Awarded a contract (\$17,000) to Jetco Ltd. of Prospect Heights for fall painting of the elevated water reservoir.
- Awarded a contract (\$7,122) to Schroeder & Schroeder of Mt. Prospect for annual sidewalk repair program.
- Approved installation of two short sections of walk to provide continuous sidewalk on Harrison west of Bel Air.
- Revised the Municipal Code's definition of passenger vehicles to include vans (up to 10 passengers).
- Authorized licensing of American Taxicab Company (4 vehicles) for public convenience and necessity.
- Approved two agreements with the State Department of Transportation, one for 100% funding by the state for thermoplastic (reflective) crosswalk markings, and the other for 90% state funding for signs, to bring them into conformance with the Uniform Traffic Code.

ANNUAL SIDEWALK REPAIR PROGRAM

The Municipal Code requires property owners to maintain public sidewalks adjacent to their properties. To help defray expenses to owners of residential properties, the Village offers a plan to share half the cost of removing and replacing broken, settled, or dangerous sections of public sidewalk. We hire a contractor to do the work, and because of the volume involved, are able to get a good price.

Your share of replacing a normal (five-foot) square of public sidewalk is only \$16.75, but you must pay it at the time you make your application.

If you want to participate this year, please fill out the form below, indicating the number of squares you need and where they should go. A member of the Village staff will call to confirm the order, the location, and to answer any questions.

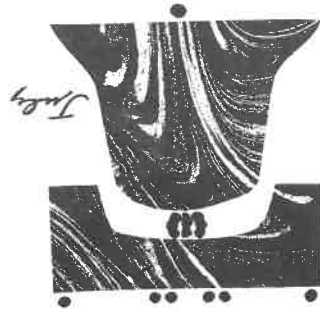
