MULTIPLE-OCCUPANCY RULING

Owners of multi-family dwellings in single-family zones must register their dwellings with the Glenview Building and Zoning Department by March 12 of this year, or be subject to immediate action to have the dwellings converted to single-family use.

Dwellings originally designed and constructed for single-family occupancy and later converted to multiple-family occupancy (including occupancy of detached structures such as garage apartments) are affected by a new ordinance adopted by the Village Board which rules that all such non-conforming uses are extended to July 1 of 1979, *provided the owner registers the dwelling by the March 12 deadline.*

Some multi-family non-conforming buildings may have permits extended to July 1 of 1989, *provided the lot size is sufficient to permit a land-area-per-dwelling unit meeting the minimum size in the zone where the dwelling is located.*

Application forms for time extensions under the new ruling are available from the Building and Zoning Department at the Village Hall.

SNOW SEASON REMINDER

Village streets are plowed when snow depth reaches 4 inches, and parked cars make it impossible for the Public Works Department to do a good job of plowing. If you can possibly park somewhere else, please do not park on the street unless it has already been plowed. Do not allow your own snow removal contractor to pile snow on the traveled part of the roadway. If you live on a street without curbs, please mark the edge of the road with reflective rods or poles so that the snow plow driver can see where the lawn begins.

VILLAGE BOARD ACTION

- Amended the zoning ordinance to extend amortization for non-conforming multiply-family dwellings (see first item on Page 1).
- Amended the zoning ordinance to increase parking requirements for nurseries and day-care centers, and to prohibit certain signs on public property.
- Rezoned Highland Lane to R-4 single-family use.
- Prohibited parking on the north side of Fir between Lincoln and Elm.
- Permitted licensing of cab associations (individual cab owners using a common dispatcher).
- Amended the official map to conform to the 1974 Northfield Township Comprehensive Plan.
- Reduced the 1974 tax levy by \$62,000, as part of the financing plan for the new fire station. (Revenue-sharing funds will be used to replace the tax money.)
- Contracted with Monroe Furniture Company (\$29,375) for furnishings for the new fire station.

FIRE PREVENTION — An Ounce is Better than a Pound!

If you still have a natural Christmas tree in the house, get rid of it immediately. It is a dangerous fire hazard by this time. DON'T BURN IT IN THE FIREPLACE! You could have a flash fire.

Make sure your furnace is running properly. If in doubt, call a reliable heating man.

Make sure the fire you build in your fireplace is not too big for the capacity of the fireplace. Always use the fire screen, and be especially careful with artificial logs made of paper, which can be extremely dangerous. Put fireplace ashes WHEN COOL into a METAL container, and make sure there are no live embers to start a fire in the ash pit. Keep the ash pit clean and free from unburnt remains from previous fireplace fires.

Make sure the hydrant nearest your home is clear of snow and easily seen. Take turns with your neighbors to keep it shoveled out. Remember that seconds count in case of fire, and damage to both property and life will occur if the Fire Department can't locate the fire plug immediately in case of an alarm.
