## NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM

Glenview is one of the flood-prone municipalities in which certain property owners are eligible to purchase federally-subsidized National Flood Insurance under a program administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. If you don't already know, call the Building and Zoning Department at the Village Hall to find out whether you are in the flood plain.

Lending institutions insured by the federal government will not lend money to buyers of homes in flood plains not covered by the insurance, which means that these homes can be purchased for cash only (a rarity in today's market).

Home owners may purchase flood insurance at 25¢ per \$100 of value up to \$35,000. Contents of the home may be covered at 35¢ per \$100 up to \$10,000 total value. (Contents coverage may also be bought by tenants of rented properties.) Owners of factories, warehouses, and apartment buildings pay 40¢ per \$100 of building value up to \$100,000, and 75¢ per \$100 on contents up to \$100,000 total value. If you need the insurance, call any licensed Illinois property and casualty insurance agent or broker.

Please note that policies cover only losses resulting from *general flooding* (i.e., a general and temporary condition of partial or complete inundation of normally dry land areas). Sewer backup losses are *not* covered, except where a general condition of flooding exists and the sewer backup is clearly a result of the general flooding.

## VILLAGE HALL TO BE OPEN TWO SATURDAYS

To deal with the inevitable last-minute rush for vehicle stickers, the Village Hall will be open on Saturday, February 8, and Saturday, February 15, from 9 AM until 12 noon.

We hope you won't wait until the bitter end, but if you do, here's your chance to get your stickers on time. Deadline for displaying the 1975 stickers is midnight Saturday, February 15. After that hour you can get a ticket for not having 1975 stickers properly displayed on your cars.

OUR NEW \$37,000 MICU (Mobile Intensive Care Unit) is literally an emergency room on wheels, ready to save your life whenever it is endangered by heart attack, stroke, or other dangerous occurrence. It is equipped with drugs, telemetry, and other electronic devices necessary to administer life-saving treatment, and when in service is in constant radio contact with several hospital emergency rooms. Lt. Charles Doetsch of the Fire Department is the director of our Emergency Medical Services program, assisted by seven highly trained Firemen-Paramedics. The service is dispatched from the Fire Department's emergency number, 724-2121.
