TO FACILITATE PROMPT REMOVAL of bulky wastes (such as large appliances and pieces of furniture) please give your waste removal company a call in advance and let it know what collection day you will be placing the item at the curb. There is no additional charge for pickup, but the company uses a different truck for these items.

YARD DEBRIS is picked up on regular collection days. Please put it in DISPOSABLE containers on the parkway no earlier than 7 PM the night before collection. Please understand that "disposable" means bags or boxes that you won't get back - they'll be picked up along with the contents.

CORRECTIVE MEASURES are being taken on streets sealed last September with materials that failed to set properly. It is hoped that by the time this Newsletter is received the roadways will once more be in proper condition.

A PUBLIC HEARING will be held Monday, June 9, 8 PM, in the Maynard Room of the Public Library. Subject: Parking regulations on Stevens Drive at Waukegan Road.

PUBLIC WORKS is using its sewer machine (a high-powered water injector) again this summer, spring, and fall, as it has done for the past several years with spectacular results. Before the equipment was added, Glenview had an average of 50 blocked sewers every year - but since we have had the machine the average has dropped to about 10.

THE GLENVIEW HEALTH DEPARTMENT, in cooperation with Northwestern University's Hearing Clinic and the Glenview Senior Citizen Club, is sponsoring a program of hearing seminars and hearing testing at the Glenview Community Church, free of charge. Seminars are open to the public, but testing is only for persons 65 or older, and is by appointment only.

Seminars will be held on THURSDAY, JUNE 26, and TUESDAY, JULY 8, from 12:30 to 1:30. Testing will be done on THURSDAY, JULY 10 and THURSDAY, July 17, from 9 AM to 12 Noon. A final seminar will be held on THURSDAY, July 17, from 12:30 to 1:30.

Appointments may be made at the July 8 seminar, or by calling the Glenview Health Department at 724-1700.

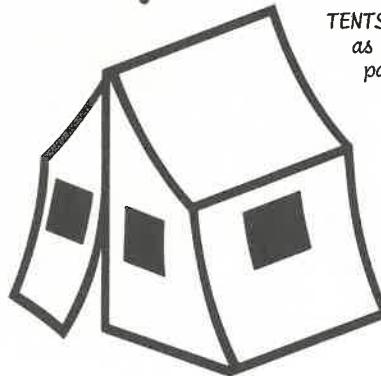
A message from the Glenview Fire Prevention Bureau:  
**ENJOY OUTDOOR LIVING SAFELY**

---



**OUTDOOR COOKING:** Start fires only with cake-form chemicals or an electric charcoal igniter approved by UL or other nationally-recognized testing lab. Never use liquid fire starter to freshen a fire. After cooking, soak the coals with water. (Seemingly dead coals may reignite a day later.)

**FUELING MOWERS AND SAWS:** Don't smoke. Do fueling outdoors in the open air. Move the machine at least 10 feet from the fueling spot before starting. Cool motor before refueling. Wipe up spills. Store gasoline in a well-ventilated spot away from any source of sparks or flame. Don't let children operate gasoline-powered tools unless you are watching them closely.



**TENTS:** Don't buy or use a tent that is not clearly labeled as flame-retardant. Old or cheap tents are coated with paraffin to keep the rain out, and are death-traps that catch fire and burn rapidly.

Statistics on those who die or are horribly mutilated are very frightening. Even with a flame-retardant tent, don't allow candles or matches. Use only flashlights.

Supervise children closely while they are tenting.

Don't let an unnecessary accident ruin your summer or your life!
