



THE FIRE DEPARTMENT hosted an Aerial Rescue School July 18 and 19, conducted by the University of Illinois Fire Service's Emergency Squad Training Institute. Besides our own firefighters, participants included personnel of Glenview Rural, Niles, and Skokie departments. Trauma Coordinator Deborah Buckley, R.N., of Lutheran General Hospital, who instructs Emergency Medical Technicians for many fire departments, also participated. Object of the training was quick rescue of persons from roofs or upper windows of tall buildings where normal means of escape or ladders cannot be used. Instruction and practice drills were conducted at the Playdium and Scott Foresman & Company buildings.

LARGE BIODEGRADABLE KRAFT BAGS are available at the Village Hall for 15¢ each. The bags are suitable for both garbage and leaves, and are recommended by environmentalists for preservation of the ecology. Why not lay in your supply now?

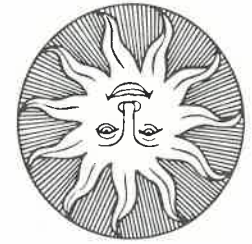

THE GLENVIEW BOARD OF TRUSTEES ...

- Entered into its annual agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation for maintenance of five state highways within Village limits (Lake Avenue, Glenview Road, Shermer Road, Central Street, and Harlem Avenue). Glenview receives a yearly reimbursement of \$20,000 for all five.
- Agreed (with Northfield Township, Northfield, Northbrook, three park districts, and all but two Northbrook school districts) to sign the revised Techny Area Land Use and Boundary Agreement.
- Awarded a paving contract (DiPaolo, Niles, for \$117,318.90) for paving on Linneman Street (Harlem east to the railroad tracks, and Elm to the dead end west of Spruce) and Spruce Street (from Linneman 150 feet south), cost to be covered by local Motor Fuel Tax funds.
- Sold a 1964 fire department squad truck to the Glenwood Fire Department for \$6,500.
- Agreed to take bids, beginning at \$21,300, for sale of a Village-owned parcel of land (93.66 x 85 feet) between Glenview Road and Dewes Street, east of the Fire Station.
- Amended the zoning ordinance to require land developers to use some means of halting soil erosion during construction, to prevent flood retention basins from filling with dirt.
- Passed the annual appropriation ordinance for fiscal 1975-76. Total for all funds is \$5,057,516.
- Amended the setback ordinance for residences to allow a new building to be set back from the road a distance of the average setback of the two buildings on either side.
- Amended the truck-parking ordinance to allow outdoor parking of trucks in non-residential zones, provided the trucks are essential to the business on whose property they are parked.
- Entered into an agreement with the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago re flood-water retention basins, to prevent massive future flooding of the west fork of the North Branch of the Chicago River. The Metropolitan Sanitary District will appropriate \$4.7 million for construction of three retention basins on land given as permanent easements by the Techny religious orders, who also agree to give \$450,000 towards engineering and administrative costs involved. Glenview agrees to supply another \$450,000 for these costs, paying \$112,500 on September 1 of 1977, 1978, 1979, and 1980. Design will begin this year, and it is anticipated that a construction contract will be awarded early in 1977. The three parties to the agreement recognize that if the project were not undertaken, Glenview could expect average annual flood damage in excess of \$825,000 per year by the year 2000, according to the Soil Conservation Service damage estimates.

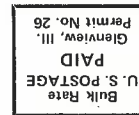

THE STATE OF ILLINOIS has awarded a contract (\$93,222.35, to Monarch Asphalt of Skokie) for resurfacing Harlem Avenue and Central Road. The Village has been seeking action in this matter for five years. Work should begin in mid-August.

THE GLENVIEW ELECTRICAL COMMISSION has vacancies for two members and a chairman to serve 3-year terms. The law requires specific qualifications: one member vacancy must be filled by someone connected with an electrical supply firm, not necessarily an engineer; a second must be filled by a registered professional electrical engineer. The third is for the chairman, who has the title of Chief Electrical Inspector, and who must hold a B.S. degree in electrical engineering. ### BLOOD NEEDS URGENT!

If you are between 17 and 65 and in good health, please call GLENVIEW BLOOD CENTRAL, 724-1700, and make an appointment to donate a pint of blood. The blood-drawing date is Tuesday, August 12, between 3 and 7 PM (Blood Central will give you a specific time). Place of the drawing is the Glenview Fire Station, 1815 Glenview Road.

Glenview Blood Central stresses the fact that late summer is a time of great need for blood replacement, as demands are high. Our blood quota for the year is 1,160 pints, and so far we have collected only 411 — far less than half the required number. Please give if you possibly can.

*A BICYCLE IS NOT A TOY! When you drive a bike on a public street, you are operating a vehicle, and are subject to the same traffic laws as drivers of cars. Drive WITH traffic, obey ALL traffic signs and signals, use HAND SIGNALS to indicate turns and stops, ride SINGLE FILE, not side-by-side with other cyclists, and don't drive a bike at night unless it has the required LIGHTS AND RED REFLECTORS. Adult cyclists should be careful to set good examples for younger cyclists. If your children ride bikes on public streets, make sure they know the rules. The Glenview Police Department has booklets on rules of the road for cyclists. Get a copy for your family, and make sure each cyclist reads and understands it.*
