THE GLENVIEW TRUSTEES ...

- Requested State authorization for repaving Elmgate and portions of Linneman and Robin Crest west of Shermer with Motor Fuel Tax funds at a cost of \$167,000.
- Voted to remove certain parking spaces on Stevens Drive west of Waukegan Road, in order to comply with State statutes regarding stop signs and crosswalks. (Future plans call for re-instating parking on Waukegan Road during non-school hours.)
- Requested the Plan Commission to schedule a Public Hearing regarding proposed changes in Northfield Township's Comprehensive Plan for the Village of Glenview.
- Sold a parcel of land between Glenview Road and Dewes, and Church and Pine, to Quark Company for \$21,450.
- Authorized an agreement with Barton-Aschman Associates, Inc., of Evanston, traffic engineering consultants, for an inventory of signs and pavement markings to cost \$15,900 — \$11,130 of which comes from a federal grant (leaving Glenview's share \$4,770).
- Appointed John H. Bungener of 721 Echo to the Building Commission for a term to expire July 31 of 1980.

THE COOK COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT has provided a set of plans for a bicycle and equestrian overpass on Lake Avenue near Blue Star Memorial entrance to the forest preserve. Such a structure will enable extension of the bicycle train north of Lake Avenue. Awarding of a contract is tentatively set for this month. Plans are available for inspection at the Public Works Department office in the Village Hall.

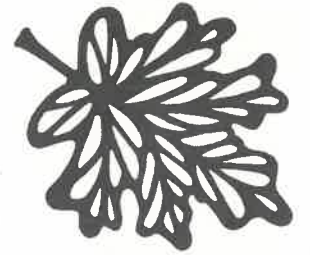
