SPECIAL CENSUS FIGURES COMPLETE

Results of the Special Federal census of July 2 show that Glenview's population is 30,551. The Village will gain revenues of \$10.50 per added resident, per year, in rebate of Motor Fuel Tax funds, and \$10.31 per added resident, per year, in rebate of State Income Tax money.

The combined increase in annual revenues will total about \$28,950. Cost of the census was \$12,457, making our net gain \$16,493 the first year (after which we gain the full increase).

PLEASE GIVE BLOOD before January 1 if you are in good health between 17 and 65 and weigh at least 110 pounds! Blood donations are urgently needed to fill Glenview's quota for this year. During the month of November
THE GLENVIEW VILLAGE BOARD ...

- Amended the Traffic code to provide for a stop sign on Bel Air at Harrison Street, and to restore parking on Waukegan Road between Stevens and Maplewood during non-school hours.
- Amended the zoning ordinance to permit decorative wooden fences (*open types only*, such as the split-rail variety, that do not contain or hide anything) to be erected in front yards.
- Made a statement of mutual intent with the Glenview Park District that upon completion of a new Village Hall, the present Village Hall property be turned into a community center for public use. (The Village plans a new municipal administration building on Waukegan Road adjacent to the Police Administration Building.) Under terms of the mutual intent statement, the Park District will lease the present Village Hall property from the Village at \$1 per year for as long as the community center exists on the property, and will bear costs of remodeling, improving, staffing, and maintaining the community center.
- Authorized Northbrook to execute a contract with General Electric of Lynchburg, Virginia (\$811,737), on behalf of NORCOM Consortium (North Regional Telecommunications Network, for the Police Departments of Glencoe, Glenview, Golf, Kenilworth, Lincolnwood, Morton Grove, Niles, Northbrook, Northfield, Skokie, Wheeling, Wilmette, and Winnetka), money to be provided by a Federal grant.
- Authorized agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation to provide commuter parking for 146 cars at the northeast corner of Depot and Grove Streets.
- Approved hiring the firm of Paul D. Speer and Associates to consult with the Village in regard to the feasibility of possible acquisition of private water companies which serve certain Village residents.
- Authorized purchase of darkroom equipment for the Fire Department (\$1,899) from General Camera Company.
- Authorized purchase of 9 police vehicles (and trade-in of old vehicles) for \$24,357.07, from Wilshore Motor Sales, Inc.
- Authorized purchase (and trade-in of old vehicles) of 2 trucks (\$12,398) from Wilshore Motor Sales, and 2 dump boxes (\$5,750) from R. G. Smith Equipment Company.
- Authorized the Village Engineer to design a relief sanitary sewer for east Glenview.
- Agreed to provide fire and ambulance service to the Village of Golf for \$11,273 for the first year of service.

MANY RESIDENTS HAVE INQUIRED as to what Glenview is doing to reduce aircraft noise at O'Hare Airport. The Village has written to the Federal Aviation Commission, urging it to require airlines to retrofit, by January 1, 1977, older jet aircraft (707's, 727's, 737's, older 747's, DC 8's, and DC 9's) with sound-absorbent engine housings similar to those on newer, quieter jets such as new 747's, DC 10's, and L 1011's. As this is an expensive proposition, the Village also suggested either a surcharge on flight tickets, or a sufficient rate increase to cover the cost of the retrofitting. Copies of the letter were sent to our Congressmen and the two Illinois U.S. Senators.

PARKWAY TREES have been planted for this year under our 50-50 program. Thanks for your interest and cooperation.

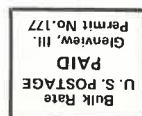

THE FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU suggests that this is probably the year you should give up using a natural Christmas tree and buy an artificial one. Natural trees were cut weeks (some of them months) ago, and have been drying out in the unseasonable heat ever since. Make sure that your artificial tree is labeled as "slow burning," and bears some evidence of having been approved for safety. Don't use lights on a metal tree or a tree with metal parts. Be careful to put your tree in a safe place (away from all heat sources) and don't allow smoking or candles anywhere near the tree. Dispose of all holiday debris (wrappings, packing materials, ribbons, etc.) promptly after presents are opened. Don't let tragedy mar your holiday joy.

IF YOU PLAN TO CELEBRATE with more alcohol than one ounce per hour (which shouldn't impair your driving ability), make arrangements in advance for someone else to drive you to and from the party, or take a taxi. Don't run the risk of losing your license, raising your insurance rates, going to jail, killing someone, or losing your own life. It isn't worth it!

CRIME AND TRAFFIC BOTH INCREASE during the holiday season. There are more hours of darkness, and weather conditions often make driving hazardous. Take precautions. Lock your car, secure your purse or wallet while shopping, put all packages in the trunk, and take added security measures at home. Thieves know there is new merchandise all over, and they want some of it. *If you haven't THEFT-GUARDED your home, this is a good time. Call 729-5000 for more information.*
