NEW AWARD THIS YEAR
AMONG GLENVIEW'S 6TH ANNUAL CIVIC HONORS

Nominations are now in order for:

- The 1972 Glenview Youth Award (new this year)
- The Glenview Citizen of 1972 Award
- The 1972 Public Service Award
- The 1972 Public Safety Award

The new Glenview Youth Award is for a resident of high-school age who has significantly contributed to school, family, or community life by helping other people outside the normal course of events, and who exemplifies the young people of the Village.

The Glenview Citizen of the year must either reside or work in Glenview, and have performed outstanding community services benefiting a large number of people. Elected Village officials and employees of the Village are not eligible.

The recipient of the Public Service Award must have given direct support to public authorities or have performed an outstanding act of bravery. Glenview police and fire personnel are not eligible.

The recipient of the Public Safety Award must be a Glenview fireman or policeman who has performed an outstanding act or service during the year.

Please be specific as to why you think the nominee should receive the award. Mail your nomination to reach Police Chief William P. Bartlett, 965 Pine Street, before Wednesday, February 7. You may use the form printed on the following page, or you may prefer to write your own letter.

Awards will be presented on Thursday, February 15, at a dinner to be held at 1560 Waukegan Road. The social hour begins at 6:30, followed by a prime rib dinner at 7:30. The program will feature sports celebrities.

The event is sponsored each year by the Glenview Service Clubs — Rotary, Lions, Kiwanis, Optimists, and the Glenview Chamber of Commerce. Tickets are \$7.50 each, and may be bought at the Chamber of Commerce office, 1545 Waukegan Road, or from any of the participating organizations.

Seating is limited each year, so early reservations are strongly advised.

NEW COMMUTER PARKING AREA

A 50-car commuter parking area — free, and reserved for Village residents only (with valid Glenview vehicle stickers on car windshields) — is now in use on the east side of Lehigh Avenue just north of Spruce Street and the Milwaukee railroad station.

The new facility has a base and its first course of asphalt, and will be given its final finish just as soon as warm weather allows in the spring. It has increased our free-parking-for-residents space by 50%.

REMINDERS ABOUT SNOW REMOVAL

Caution the snow removal contractor who does your driveway not to leave snow in the street. Glenview has an ordinance prohibiting snow being piled on any public thoroughfare. (It's dangerous.)

If you shovel your own driveway, pile the bulk of the snow on the right-hand side (as you face the street). That way, a minimal amount will be ridged across the driveway when the Village plow passes.

If there is a hydrant on your property line, please keep it clear of snow all winter. The Fire Department has no time to waste digging for it in case your house or your neighbor's catches fire.

GLENVIEW'S 125 CUL-DE-SACS cannot be effectively cleared by our large snow plows. After the plow has cleared the adjoining street, one of the Public Works Department jeeps will follow shortly to take care of the cul-de-sac. Please be patient ... your cul-de-sac will not be missed.

SINCE YOUR LAST REPORT

The Glenview Trustees...

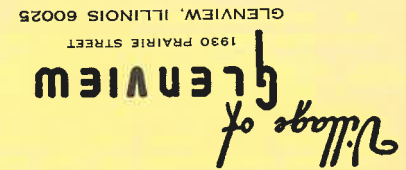
- Approved the sale of \$1.4 million in General Obligation Bonds for a new Police Administration Building to Northern Trust Company for a net interest rate of 4.67%. This low interest rate is due, in part, to a new and higher municipal bond rating of A-1 for Glenview.
- Awarded a contract to Ockerlund Construction Company of Morton Grove for \$940,000 for construction of the new Police Administration Building at 1215 Waukegan Road.
- Denied rezoning for 32 apartment units at the southeast corner of Chestnut Avenue and Riverside Court.
- Approved rezoning of the C. D. Johnson land parcel at Pfingsten and Rugen Roads to Planned Development use, for a condominium complex.
- Approved an agreement with the North Suburban Association for Health Resources, whereby all Glenview residents, Village employees and families, and participating groups (such as businesses located in Glenview) and families, may donate blood, and in return be assured blood replacement when needed, on a yearly basis. Individuals make one personal blood donation per year per family; groups are covered by donations of 20% of the resident and 20% of the non-resident members annually. A total of 1160 pints of blood per year will cover everyone in Glenview.
- Approved the Techny Area Joint Planning Commission Agreement, to facilitate cooperation among the Villages of Glenview, Northfield, and Northbrook, and their Park Districts, in connection with Techny's development of its vacant property.
- Filed an objection with the Cook County Zoning Board re application for rezoning for four acres on the north side of Lake Avenue near Milwaukee Avenue, for a catering establishment and parking lot.
- Confirmed the appointment of Mathew K. Szygowski of 4124 Crestwood Drive, The Willows, to the Zoning Board of Appeals, to replace Willard Sprague, who has resigned. Mr. Szygowski is an attorney with a wide background that includes real estate, taxation, and municipal law, as well as zoning and annexation.

THE COOK COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS has denied rezoning for a service station at the corner of Glenview and Glenshire Roads, and for multiple-family dwellings on Milwaukee Avenue north of Glenview Road. Glenview had objected to both applications.
