OFFICIAL TRICK-OR-TREAT NIGHT: TUESDAY, OCTOBER 30

Mayor Edward K. Patten, in cooperation with the Glenview Park District and its Citizens' Committee, has issued a proclamation designating TUESDAY, OCTOBER 30, between 4 and 8:30 PM, as official "trick-or-treat" time in Glenview.

All witches, ghosts, goblins, and other Hallowe'en tricksters are asked to make their calls *between those hours only, and only on Tuesday, October 30.*

Here's some good advice:

- WEAR LIGHT-COLORED COSTUMES, which are easily visible after dark, and therefore scarier than dark-colored ones. (Reflecting tape can be used for especially ghostly effects.)
- Be sure your clothes and shoes are WARM AND COMFORTABLE. (You're out to have fun, and you want to enjoy yourself.)
- Don't wear masks, beards, wigs, veils, or floppy hats, because you won't be able to see well, and you might miss something. USE BURNT CORK OR OTHER FACE MAKEUP for a ghastly living mask. (If you put on cold cream first, the makeup will come off easier at bedtime.)
- Don't use flares or candles. CARRY FLASHLIGHTS instead.
- Don't take too large a treat bag — it might trip you.
- APPOINT A HEAD GOBLIN for your group — an older brother or sister, or a mom or dad. The Head Goblin will help organize your tour, and you'll get around faster and have more fun. (The Head Goblin will dress up, too, if you ask.)
- DON'T GO INSIDE ANYONE'S HOUSE. Wait on porch or steps for treats.
- DON'T EAT ANYTHING until you get home and have your parents inspect your loot very carefully.

Neighborhood parties in the parks for younger children and a dance for 7th and 8th graders will be held by the Park District on Hallowe'en evening, Wednesday, October 31.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE



BURNING OF LEAVES, like burning of tree limbs, trash, garbage, or yard and household debris of any kind, is strictly prohibited in Glenview.

LEAVES MUST BE BAGGED, the bags sealed, and placed at the curb for removal from your premises.

- Use bags with a capacity of no more than 30 gallons.
- Best times to place bags at curb: late the night before, or very early morning on collection day.
- No loose leaves, or leaves in containers other than sealed bags, will be picked up.

YOUR REGULAR WASTE DISPOSAL CONTRACTOR will pick up bagged leaves at the curb now, and will continue to pick up as many as four bags per stop during the peak period — last part of October and first part of November.

THE VILLAGE OF GLENVIEW has arranged again this year for Special Leaf Collections during the peak period. No matter where you live in Glenview, you will have four Special Leaf Collection dates:

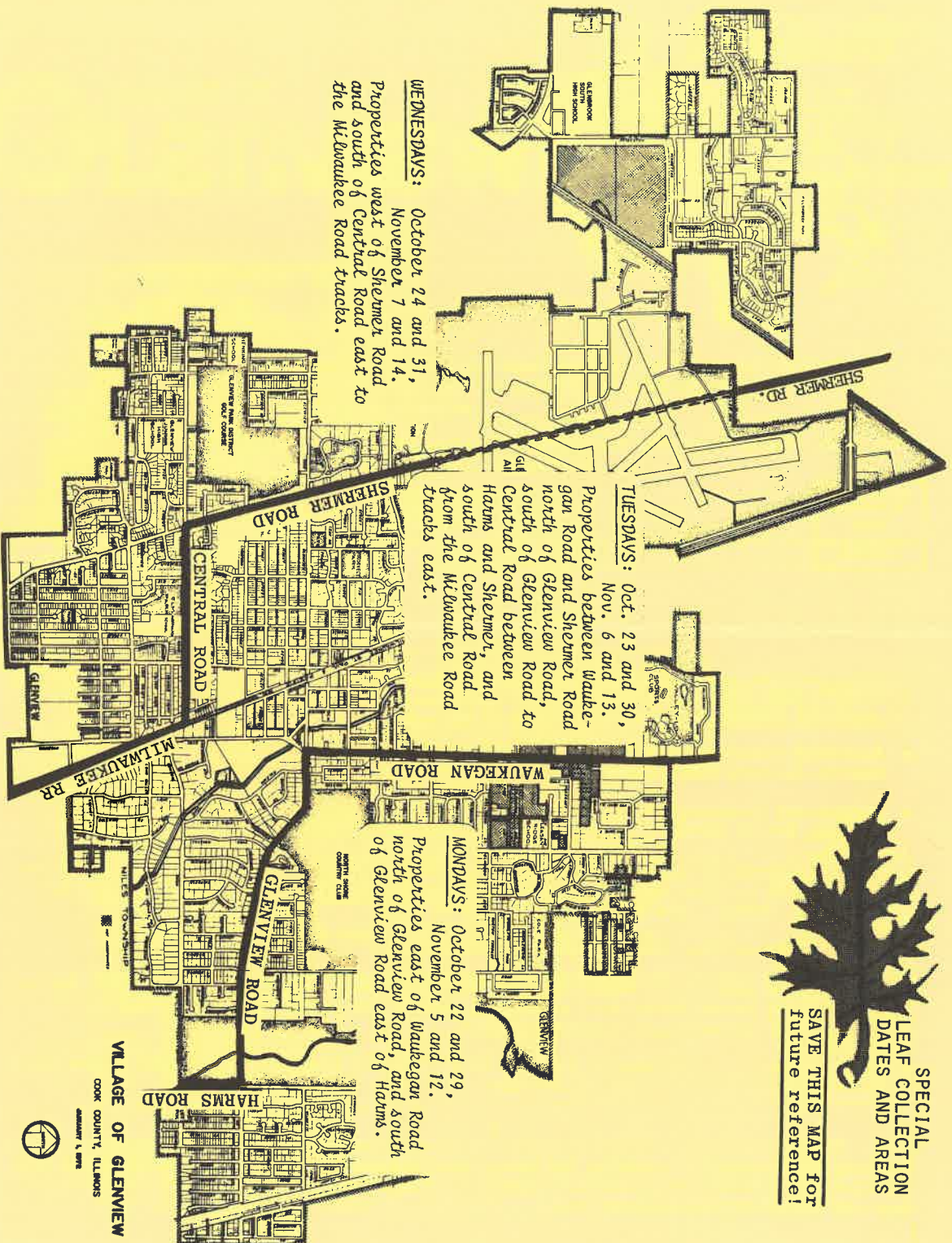

PLEASE DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO THE STREET. Village street-cleaning equipment is unable to pick up more leaves than those naturally falling on the pavement. Bag your leaves, seal the bags, and leave them on the curb for pickup as described above.

of Glenview Road east of Harms.*

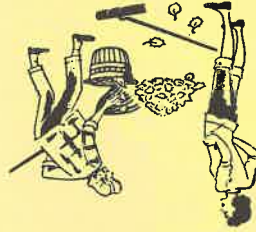

Since your last report
THE GLENVIEW TRUSTEES

- Appointed Laurence R. Steenberg of 1124 Raleigh Road Chairman of the Environmental Quality Advisory Committee, replacing Edmond J. Coleman, who has resigned.
- Reappointed Steenberg and members Virginia Beckwith, Theodore Brickman, Jr., Pat Clemens, Dennis Hartnett, and Adam Stach to terms expiring August 21, 1974.
- Appointed former Village President Paul H. Thomas of 1413 London Lane Glenview's Trustee of the North Suburban Mass Transit District, replacing William T. Morgan, Jr., who has resigned. Thomas' term expires in February of 1976.
- Annexed 1834 Waukegan Road (Burger King restaurant).
- Approved the LeRoy Koetz Subdivision at 1604-24 Waukegan Road, subject to certain further requirements before issuance of a building permit, and granted conditional use for a Porsche-Audi dealership at the same address.
- Denied rezoning of portions of Glen Oak Acres from R-4 (single-family 10,000 square feet) to R-3 (single-family 14,520 square feet).

Glenview had objected to rezoning the Karnes Building Corporation property on Milwaukee Avenue (for use as a motorcycle and sub-compact car dealership), and Cook County Commissioners have now denied the rezoning petition.
