**VILLAGE HALL OPEN 2 SATURDAYS FOR  
PURCHASE OF 1972 VILLAGE VEHICLE STICKERS**

For your convenience, the Glenview Village Hall will be open on two Saturdays — FEBRUARY 5 and FEBRUARY 12 — from 9 AM to 12 Noon, particularly to take care of purchases of 1972 Glenview Vehicle Stickers.

The deadline for purchase of the stickers is Tuesday, February 15, and they must be displayed on that date. At 12:01 AM on Wednesday, February 16, Glenview Police will begin ticketing automobiles not bearing 1972 stickers.

Cars over 35 hp .....	15.00
[To persons over 65, 1 vehicle per family @ half price]	
Motor Bikes .....	4.50
Trucks under 8,000 lbs. ....	20.00
Trucks 8,000 to 15,999 lbs. ....	30.00
Trucks 16,000 to 23,999 lbs. ....	40.00
Trucks 24,000 lbs. or more .....	50.00
Buses not certified by the Illinois Commerce Commission ....	22.00
Buses authorized by the Illinois Commerce Commission ....	30.00

DEADLINE FOR PURCHASE OF 1972 DOG LICENSES is Tuesday, February 15. Dog owners must present a current rabies certificate with application for each new license. Cost is \$3 per license, at the Village Hall.

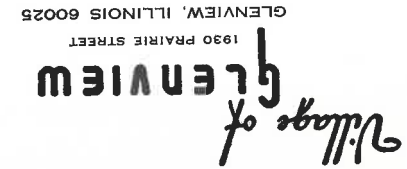

- Annexed three lots on Glen Oak Drive, and the highway intersection of Pfingsten Road and Lake Avenue.
- Granted an easement to Commonwealth Edison across the north ten feet of elevated water tank property, for underground cable.
- Approved the recommendation of the Plan Commission that the 1700 blocks of Dewes, Henley and Linneman Streets remain zoned R-18 [multiple family use].
