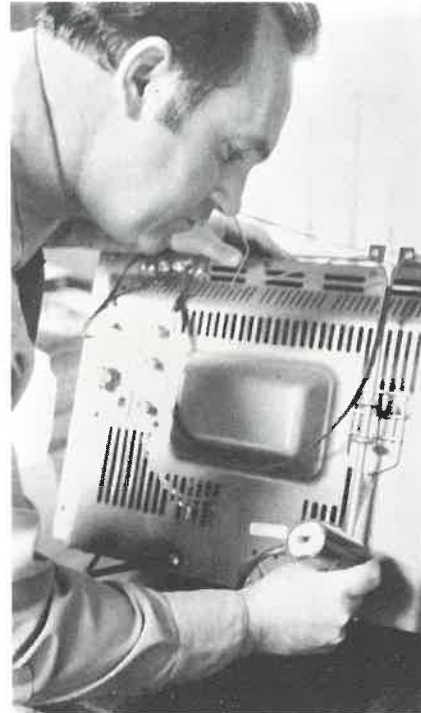

PROJECT THEFT-GUARD COMES TO GLENVIEW



The Glenview Police Department is cooperating with property owners' organizations and others interested in Project THEFT-GUARD, which involves engraving private possessions with the owner's driver license number. Such objects as television sets, radios, tape recorders, stereo sets, typewriters, adding machines, cameras, binoculars, musical instruments, guns, power tools, lawn mowers, bicycles — anything having a metal or glass surface suitable for engraving — should be marked with the owner's driver license number. (Marking on such easily removable parts as lids, plates or doors should be avoided.)

Quite a number of electric engraving tools are now available on loan at no charge. Once your possessions are marked they can be quickly identified in case of theft. The Glenview Police Department has LEADS (Law Enforcement Agencies Data System) equipment, enabling direct contact with a computer in Springfield, which responds to

a driver license number with the name of the licensee, all in a matter of minutes.

Stickers are available for houses, car bumpers and bicycles. The house stickers inform would-be burglars that the valuables inside are engraved for ready police identification. Bumper stickers urge community participation in Project THEFT-GUARD. Bicycle stickers say that the bike is protected by the Project.

Glenview Police Cadets will be marking children's bicycles for THEFT-GUARD during Bicycle Safety Week, May 15-19, when they will visit all schools in Glenview with films and talks, and will inspect and license all bicycles. (A parent's driver license number will be engraved on the child's bike.)

Project THEFT-GUARD has been operating successfully in other parts of the country since 1963, and Glenview Police Chief William P. Bartlett believes it will function well in Glenview — both as a crime deterrent and a means of quick identification of stolen goods.

YOUR DOG CANNOT GO TO THE MEAT MARKET ALONE!

That's because it's illegal for dogs to go *anywhere* alone in Glenview. Actually, the law was not passed to keep your Fido from doing responsible jobs, such as going to the meat market alone. It was passed to keep those *other* (less responsible) canines from what is called "running loose."



UNFORTUNATELY, your highly responsible Fido, being a visible dog, must comply with the law, and NEVER go out alone. And when he goes out with you, he must go on a leash.

Explain to him, while you are polishing his halo, that he is a saint — and that saints must also be martyrs sometimes. Explain that if he goes out alone, he will be arrested and you will be stiffly fined. (Being a saint, Fido will understand.)

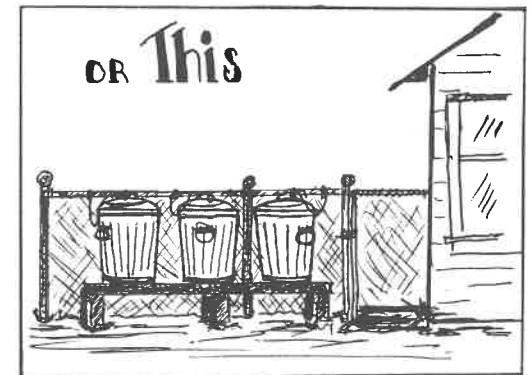
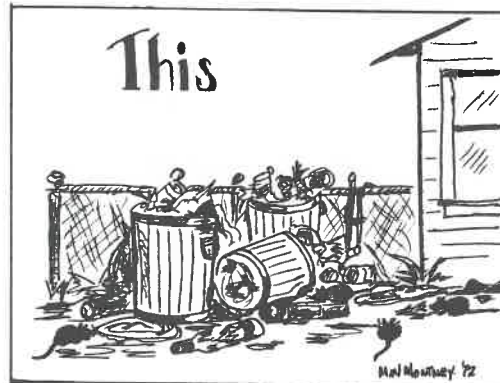

SINCE YOUR LAST REPORT  
The Glenview Trustees . . .

- Amended the traffic code governing parking on Lehigh Avenue, to allow for a "kiss and ride" area on the west side of Lehigh, opposite the Commuter Plaza. (A "kiss and ride" area is where the commuter's car pulls up while he kisses his wife, then rides the train.) Parking limit will be 30 minutes. The widened pavement, sidewalk and curbing are to be constructed this summer.
- Passed an ordinance allowing construction of a Metropolitan Sanitary District sewer extension up Lehigh from a point north of Chestnut to Willow Road.
- Awarded a contract for \$23,952.50 to Blackmore Sewer Company for a water main extension on Chestnut Avenue from Riverside Court to Waukegan Road.
- Accepted the Plan Commission recommendation approving the West Fork Green concept.
- Annexed one lot at 1420 Hollywood Avenue.
