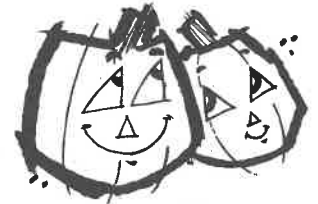

MONDAY, OCTOBER 30 -- OFFICIAL "TRICK-OR-TREAT" TIME

President Paul H. Thomas, in cooperation with the Glenview Park District and its Citizens' Committee, has issued a proclamation designating Monday, October 30, between 3 and 8:30 PM, as official "trick-or-treat" time in Glenview. All witches, ghosts, goblins, and other Halloween tricksters are asked to make their calls between those hours only, and only on October 30.



Here's some good advice:

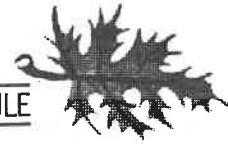
- Wear light-colored costumes — easily visible after dark, and therefore scarier than dark-colored ones. Reflecting tape can be used for especially ghostly effects.
- Be sure your clothes and shoes are comfortable. (You're out to have fun, remember.)
- Don't wear masks, beards, wigs, veils, or floppy hats, because you won't be able to see well, and you might miss something. Use burnt cork and other face makeup for a ghastly living mask. (If you use cold cream first, makeup will come off easier at bedtime.)
- Don't use flares or candles. Carry flashlights instead.
- Don't take too large a treat bag — it might trip you.
- Appoint a Head Goblin for your group — an older brother or sister or a mom or dad. The Head Goblin will help organize your tour, and you'll get around faster and have more fun. (The Head Goblin will dress up, too, if you ask.)
- Don't go inside strange homes — wait on porch or steps for treats.

NOTE TO PARENTS OF HALLOWEEN TRICKSTERS: Buy only costumes and accessories labeled non-combustible by the manufacturer. If you home-make the costumes, treat them with a fire-retardant solution. Be extremely careful about Halloween decorations, which are usually dry and easily ignited. Use no candles, and make sure any electric-lighting effects are well away from decorations.

NOTE TO GLENVIEW MOTORISTS: Please be extra-cautious between 3 and 8:30 PM on Monday, October 30. Witches, goblins, ghosts, and other Halloween monsters sometimes forget to watch out for cars.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE



BURNING OF LEAVES, like burning of tree limbs, trash, garbage, or yard and household debris of any kind, is strictly prohibited in Glenview.

LEAVES MUST BE BAGGED, the bags sealed, and placed at the curb for removal from your premises.

- Use bags with a capacity of no more than 30 gallons.
- Best times to place bags at curb: late the night before, or very early morning on collection day.
- No loose leaves, or leaves in containers other than sealed bags, will be picked up.

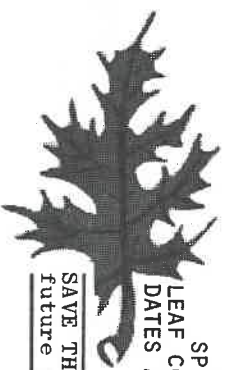
YOUR REGULAR WASTE DISPOSAL CONTRACTOR will pick up bagged leaves at the curb now, and will continue to pick up as many as four bags per stop during the peak period — last part of October and first part of November.

THE VILLAGE OF GLENVIEW has arranged again this year for Special Leaf Collections during the peak period. No matter where you live in Glenview, you will have four Special Leaf Collection dates:

<u>MONDAYS</u>	All curbsides east of Waukegan Road north of Glenview Road, and south of Glenview Road east of Harms Road. (See upper right-hand portion of the map on the opposite page.)

<u>TUESDAYS</u>	All curbsides between Waukegan Road and Shermer Road north of Glenview Road, south of Glenview Road to Central Road between Harms and Shermer, and south of Central from the Milwaukee tracks east. (Central portion of map.)

<u>WEDNESDAYS</u>	All curbsides west of Shermer Road north of Central Road, and south of Central Road east to the Milwaukee Railroad tracks. (See lower left-hand portion of the map.)

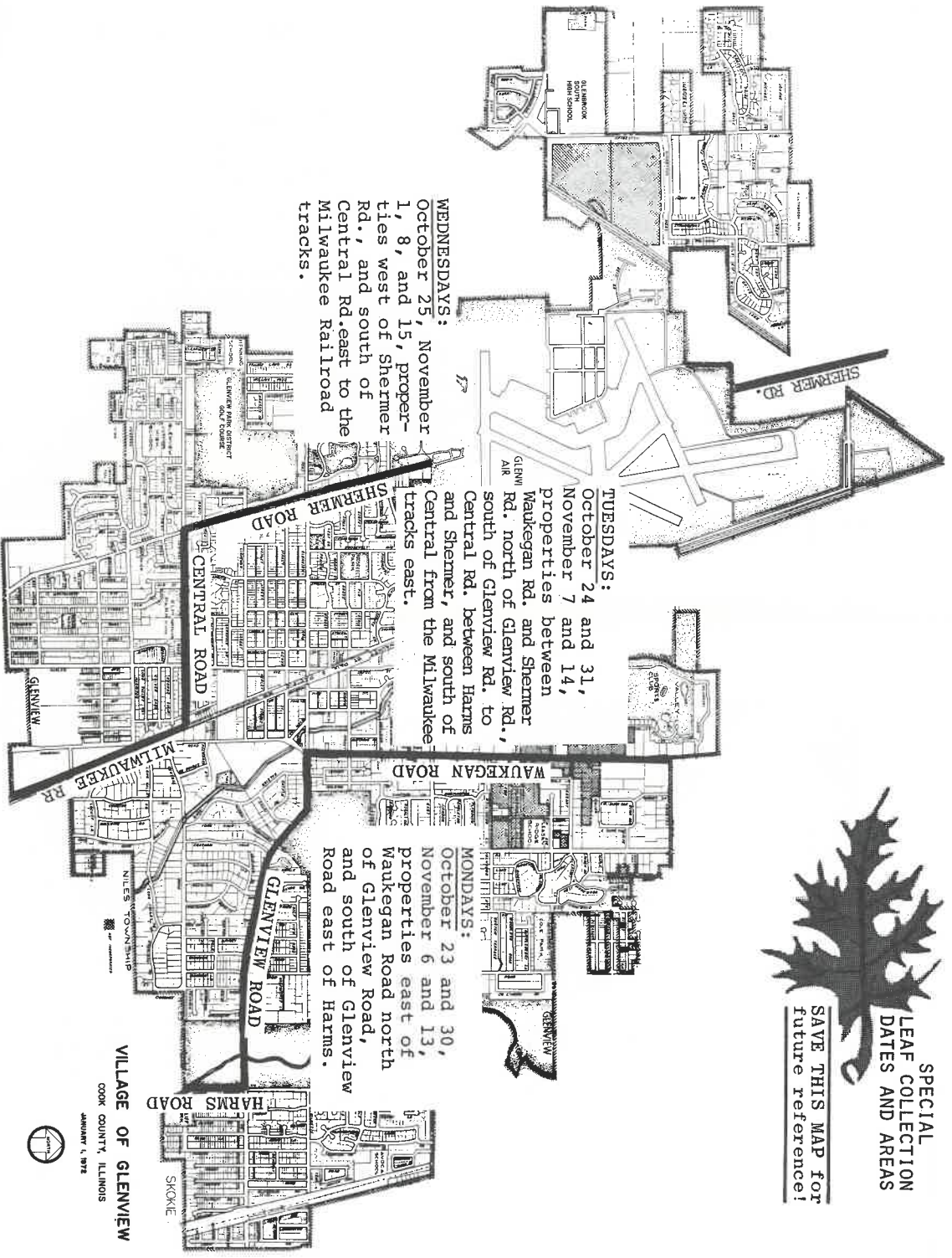
PLEASE DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO THE STREET. Village street-cleaning equipment is unable to pick up more leaves than those naturally falling on the pavement. Bag your leaves, seal the bags, and leave them on the curb for pickup as described above.

THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT REMINDS YOU . . .

It's soon time to start thinking about getting those edge-of-pavement markers in the ground, before it freezes (if you live in an area where there are no curbs).

Probably the cheapest and most durable markers are broom handles, available at hardware stores. Paint them white and ring the tops with red reflective tape.

Make sure anything you use to mark your lawn's edge for the snow plow is high enough and bright enough to be seen in a snowstorm. The plow driver will not damage the edge of your lawn if he can tell where it is.

ANIMAL AND RABIES CONTROL ORDINANCE



Glenview Trustees have just passed a new ordinance aimed at better control of rabies and disturbance by animals within Village limits.

Under the new law, no one in Glenview may keep dogs, cats, or other animals that disturb the peace and quiet of any individual, family, or neighborhood.

Cats must now be licensed, the same as dogs, for a fee of \$3 each per year, payable in advance of January 1 each year. (Replacements for lost tags will be given for 50¢ each.) Both dogs and cats must at all times wear collars with license tags attached. License tags are not transferable.

All cats and dogs over four months old must be inoculated against rabies. No license will be issued to any animal which does not have a current rabies immunization certificate.

Any dog, licensed or not, found running at large, and any dog or cat not wearing a current license tag, will be impounded. Redemption fees are \$5 for the first offense, and \$10 for each succeeding offense.

No one is allowed to permit a dog, cat, or other pet animal to create any nuisance (including the depositing of fecal matter) anywhere except on his own property. If such deposits are allowed to remain on anyone else's property, the aggrieved property owner may sign a complaint against the owner of the animal.

No animal may be taken, led, or carried into any food-dispensing establishment in Glenview, but the owner of such an establishment may keep a dog or a cat on the premises, provided it is barred from rooms where food is dispensed or stored.

Violations of the Animal Control ordinance are misdemeanors, punishable by fines ranging from \$10 to \$500 for each offense.

THESE IMPORTANT ILLINOIS SAFETY LAWS GOVERN
THE RIGHTS OF PEDESTRIANS AT CROSSWALKS:

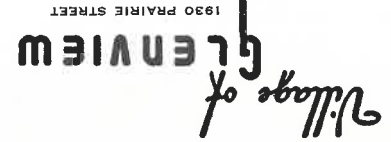
- Where there are no traffic signals working, the motorist must yield the right of way to pedestrians, slowing — or even stopping, if necessary — to let them cross.
- Where stop signs or flashing red signals are present, pedestrians have the right of way.
- At any crosswalk where a vehicle is stopped to permit pedestrians to cross, drivers approaching from the rear of the stopped vehicle shall not overtake or pass.

When you are making a turn and the pedestrian has the light in his favor, you are required to wait until the pedestrian crosses the intersection before you complete your turn. Please be safe as well as courteous.
