SINCE YOUR LAST REPORT  
the Glenview Board of Trustees ...

- PASSED AN ORDINANCE carefully defining litter, and providing that any individual, firm, or corporation who litters in the Village of Glenview shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25 or more than \$500 for each violation.
- PASSED ORDINANCES making three-way stops at Raleigh and Grove and at Elizabeth and Bonnie Glen. This is an effort to improve safety for the residents of this neighborhood.
- AMENDED THE PLUMBING CODE, so that all new construction in Glenview must use overhead plumbing, in order to conform to the 1971 requirement of the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago.
- ANNEXED 15 PROPERTIES on King's Lane, west of Wagner Road and south of Winnetka Avenue.
- APPROVED A REQUEST for state approval to use Motor Fuel Tax funds for left-turn signal arrows at Glenview and Waukegan Roads.
- RECEIVED STATE APPROVAL for plans to widen the intersection at Glenview Road and Shermer Avenue.

GLENVIEW HAS BEEN RECLASSIFIED to a Fourth Class fire insurance rating, as of December 15, 1970.

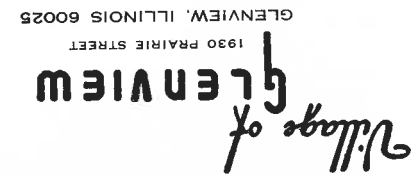
This has been the result of an intensive effort on the part of Chief Kenneth Wood and the members of the Glenview Fire Department, of whom we are very proud. It is also part of the continuous policy of improvement supported by the Board of Trustees and the citizens of the Village of Glenview.

(Class Two, which is tops in the U.S. so far, is the rating held by the City of Chicago. Glenview was formerly in Class Five.)

We are advised that Chicago area fire insurance rates are generally being increased when policies are renewed. However, the new Fourth Class rating should save some premium cost for commercial property owners, landlords, and tenants. It will not affect broad form owner-occupied single-family home premiums.

Check with your insurance agent when your policy comes up for renewal.

THE GLENVIEW VILLAGE HALL has received the Audubon Society of Illinois' "Salute to Beauty" Award for 1970, for our "outstanding contribution in landscaping of the premises for the betterment and beautification of the community and environment."

The Audubon Society, established in 1897 for the protection of wild birds and the preservation of the natural environment, was far ahead of the rest of us in its concern for these things. The Chicago Chapter is headquartered at the Field Museum of Natural History in Chicago.

Our certificate of commendation, of which we are very proud, is now on view at the Glenview Village Hall.
