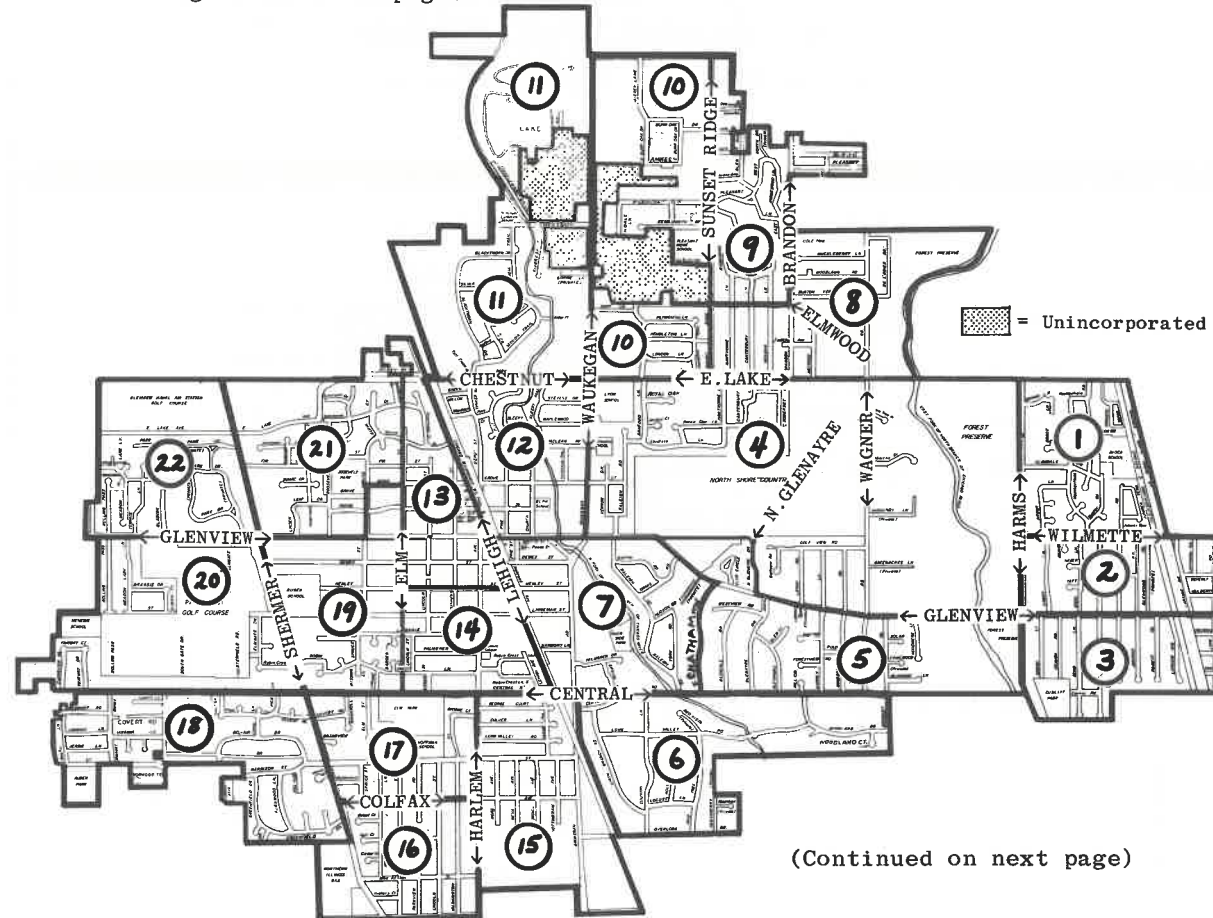

Polling places will be open from 6 AM to 6 PM.

Those who are going to be out of Cook County, or those who are sick or disabled and cannot get to the polls, may vote absentee, provided that they make application for Absentee Voting BEFORE APRIL 15 to vote by mail, and BEFORE APRIL 17 to vote in person. All applications for Absentee Voting should be made at the Village Hall during business hours for those voting in person, and to the Village Hall, 1930 Prairie Street, Glenview, Illinois 60025, by those requesting by mail.

SINCE YOUR LAST REPORT
the Glenview Board of Trustees . . .

- Has asked a representative of the Glenview Disposal Company to attend the Village Board meeting on Monday, April 5, to explain the progress being made to correct causes of past complaints.
- Granted a parade permit for the Sunday, May 9, "Walk for Development." Part of the Walk's 30-mile course is through the Village of Glenview.
- Approved the Ginaine Resubdivision, one lot at 1245 Waukegan Road, for construction of a two-story office building.
- Awarded a contract (\$8,361.10) to Contracting and Material Company of Evanston, to add left-turn arrows to the traffic signals at the intersection of Glenview and Waukegan Roads.
- Confirmed appointments of CAROL PATTERSON of 900 Echo to the Plan Commission and DR. JOHN E. ZUR of 1506 Basswood to the Board of Health. Dr. Zur, a licensed dentist, also holds a degree in Public Health.
- Authorized appointment of a part-time Public Health Administrator, and the post is now filled by appointment of WILLIAM J. HIXON of 417 Washington. He is Assistant Public Health Administrator of the Evanston-North Shore Health Department, where he has been employed for 21 years.

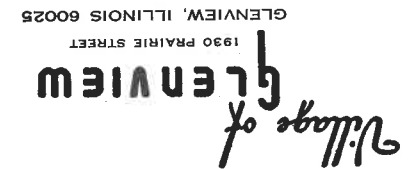
VILLAGE PRESIDENT PAUL H. THOMAS, acting chairman of the local flood control steering committee, has written to representatives in Washington urging amendment of the public law restricting the use of soil conservation service money for retention basins. Practical application of this law results in benefits to rural areas only.

In response, Senators Percy and Stevenson, among others, have introduced Senate Bill 1156, which would allocate additional funds for flood control and permit the use of soil conservation money in urban areas.

GLENVIEW HAS HAD a Sound Engineer study the relationship between noise and altitude of planes flying over the Village in approaching O'Hare Airport. Results show that the greatest noise factor is not low altitude, but the amount of power applied by the pilot when he is required to take a place in a holding pattern, and thus fly at relatively low air speed. This is necessary during O'Hare's busiest hours.

HINSDALE SANITARIUM will sponsor a 5-day plan to stop smoking, April 18 through 22, in Hinsdale. The cost is \$5, and a registration card may be obtained by calling Mrs. Cook, Glenview Village Health Educator, at the Village Hall (724-1700). Later this year the same program may be available here in Glenview. If you are interested, please let Mrs. Cook know.
