NEW TRUSTEES, LIBRARY DIRECTORS ELECTED

CASES OF PUBLIC HAZARD
during off-hours

In case of public hazard (stopped-up sewer, cave-in, broken water main, fallen tree, live wires down, etc.) during hours when the Village Hall is closed, you should call the Glenview Police Department, 724-2131.

The Police will, in turn, get in touch with the Public Works Department, and immediate action will be taken.

Just make sure you have a real emergency -- one that might endanger the public safety and cannot wait until regular Village Hall hours, 9 to 5, Monday through Friday.

CANCER MOBILE UNIT

The parking lot at the northeast corner of Glenview Road and Pine Street will be the location of the American Cancer Society's mobile unit on Friday, May 14, from 9 AM to 5 PM.

No X-rays nor medications will be dispensed. This is an educational unit in which you may see informational movies and get free literature about cancer and its symptoms.

"WATCH" REQUESTS

If you would like to have Glenview Police watch your house while you are on vacation this summer, please go in person to Police Headquarters, 965 Pine Street, and fill out the WATCH REQUEST form. Watch requests cannot be taken over the telephone because they interfere with the handling of emergency calls.

STREET ADDRESSES

must be posted legibly

Glenview Fire Chief KEN WOOD reminds you that you are required by law to have a numbered sign on your house or place of business. It must be distinctly readable, night or day. This law is for your own safety.

Firemen can waste precious time, resulting in possible costly property loss and loss of lives, searching for the address to which they have been called.

If your house is some distance from the road or street, please display a numbered sign somewhere on your property that can be easily read from the thoroughfare.

PEDESTRIAN RIGHT-OF-WAY

Glenview Police Chief BILL BARTLETT reminds you that at any corner, the pedestrian has the right of way.

When you turn a corner in your car, with the signal in your favor, please bear in mind that it is in the pedestrian's favor as he is crossing the street.

Wait for the pedestrian to travel the intersection safely before you complete your turn.



ARE YOU A DOG OWNER?

If you are, please be sure to read the last page of this Newsletter carefully.

We know that Glenview dog owners love their pets and do not want them to run afoul of the law!

TORNADO PRECAUTIONS

Two long high-pitched blasts on the air raid siren signify a natural disaster warning. May is the month when most tornadoes strike.

A TORNADO "WATCH" alerts you that tornadoes are possible. A TORNADO "WARNING" should be taken very seriously, as it means that a tornado has actually been spotted. When the radio tells you there is a tornado warning, take cover immediately.

AT HOME: Go to the southwest corner of the basement (the corner that will be towards the tornado in this area). If you have no basement, take cover under heavy furniture in the center of the house. Open some windows, but stay away from them.

IN OFFICE BUILDINGS: Go to an interior hallway on a lower floor, preferably the basement.

IN FACTORIES: Post a lookout after a tornado warning is issued, and have workers ready to move to the section of the plant offering the most protection.

OUT OF DOORS: Move away from the tornado at right angles. If you are directly in its path, lie flat on the ground, face down, in the nearest depression (such as a ditch or ravine, if you can get there in time).

IN SCHOOLS: Go to an interior hallway on the lowest floor. Avoid windows and gymnasiums or auditoriums with large roofs that could collapse.

Glenview Elementary School District 34, Glenbrook High School District 225, Our Lady of Perpetual Help School, and St. Catherine Laboure School have issued the following statement:
"Children will be kept in school until the immediate danger is over."

IN PARKS: The Glenview Park District facilities will be closed and children will be sent home, except from the Golf Course, where shelter is available at the Club House.

AT LITTLE LEAGUE FIELDS AND BALL GROUNDS: Get away from refreshment stands, bleachers and backstops. Move away from the tornado at right angles. If you are already in its path, lie flat on the ground, face down, in the nearest depression (such as a ditch or a ravine, if you can get there in time).

IN BUSES: All occupants should get off the bus and away from it and lie flat on the ground, face down, in the nearest depression (ditch or ravine).

IN CARS: Leave the car and seek shelter, or lie flat on the ground, face down, in the nearest depression (ditch or ravine). If there isn't time, open the car windows and lie as flat as possible, face covered.

SANCTUARIES: Public buildings, including schools, both public and private, the Park District Golf Course Club House, and Roosevelt Park Field House.

KEEP TUNED TO THE RADIO OR TV for latest reports. All stations will be carrying special bulletins.

REPORT ANY TORNADO YOU SPOT OR PICK UP on an amateur radio. Call either the State Police, 827-0101, or the Glenview Police, 724-2131.

PLEASE CALL THESE PRECAUTIONS TO THE ATTENTION OF EVERY MEMBER OF YOUR FAMILY, the baby-sitter, and whoever else might be in charge of your home when you are away.

SINCE YOUR LAST REPORT
Glenview Village Trustees ...

- Received State approval of Glenview's plans for the rebuilding of the intersection at Glenview and Shermer Roads, to permit through traffic to move past cars waiting to turn left.
- Amended Glenview's Comprehensive Plan, adopting much of the text of the Northfield Township Comprehensive Plan as it applies to Glenview. Included are a statement of goals and objectives and an entirely new official map which more accurately reflects present county zoning within our jurisdictional area (1½ miles outside Village limits).
- Directed the Village Attorney to file a petition in Cook County Circuit Court calling for a referendum to annex the Glenview Naval Air Station, Glenbrook High School South, Willows, Willows West and Willows North Subdivisions, plus a few other residential and industrial properties west of the Air Station.
- Joined Cook County in opposing application for B-5 rezoning on the west side of Milwaukee Avenue just south of the Sanders Road intersection.
- Approved a one-lot subdivision for the Kraftco International Headquarters building, under construction on a 40-acre site located between Waukegan Road and Harlem Avenue, just north of the Golfview Shopping Center. (The property, known locally as the Schmelzer-Rovik tract, had previously been slated for apartments.)
- Approved an 85-lot subdivision known as Glenbrook Estates, located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Lake Avenue and Pflingsten Road. This subdivision was started without our approval. The Village insisted upon, and the court supported, a requirement that the subdivision obtain Village approval.
- Approved an ordinance to purchase real estate at 1873 Glenview Road, to be used for a new police administration building.

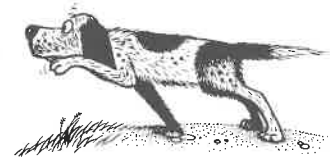

MUCH AS YOUR DOG MAY LOVE TO,
it cannot run loose in Glenview.

It is against the law, and our Animal Warden is required to pick up all dogs running loose.



The law says that unless your dog is on your own property, it must be held securely on a leash.

Dog owners are asked to remember that other homeowners do not appreciate having you "exercise" your dog on their properties. (It's your dog, so please walk it in your own yard and clean up after it yourself.)

ANOTHER REMINDER: All Glenview dogs must be licensed. The cost is \$3, and the license may be obtained at the Village Hall. A license is of the utmost importance in case your dog accidentally breaks loose and gets lost. The Police will then let you know when the dog has been picked up.
