TRICK-OR-TREAT NIGHT
Saturday, October 30 . . . ONE NIGHT ONLY!

The Village President and all Glenview civic associations have designated SATURDAY, OCTOBER 30, "Beggar's Night" in Glenview, and ruled that all trick-or-treating activities must end promptly at 8:30 PM.

The reasons for the decision to have one night only for trick-or-treating are many, but the most important are those cited by Glenview Police Chief William P. Bartlett:

"Parents appreciate some guidance from the community, and find it helpful in planning their children's activities. Having a single night helps not only parents, but all residents of the Village of Glenview, who can then be prepared with porch or entry lights on and treats in good supply.

"Most of all, a single-night schedule helps the Glenview Police to assure children's safety. We can warn motorists in advance that this night, Saturday, October 30, is the night they should exercise extreme care in driving, in order to protect excited little children wearing masks and dark or cumbersome costumes."

Chief Bartlett added that the one-night schedule will allow him to concentrate all his police manpower on that single date, to assure maximum protection.

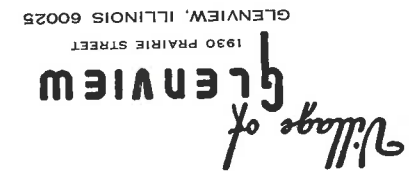
You are urged to cooperate with Village officials and all civic organizations of Glenview by seeing that your children observe only this one night of trick-or-treating.

NEW VEHICLE STICKERS AND DOG LICENSES for 1972

You will soon receive through the mail your application forms for Glenview vehicle stickers and dog licenses for the coming year.

Both vehicle stickers and dog licenses will go on sale Monday, November 15, at the Village Hall.

When you receive your applications by mail, you can save yourself some time by returning the applications, with your check, by mail. (Please use separate application forms for each car and dog, and enclose current rabies certificate for each dog.) Receipts, stickers, dog tags and rabies certificates will all be mailed back to you.

HELPFUL HINT for applying your new vehicle sticker: it will adhere much better if you warm the glass first with your car heater.
