Pedestrians crossing at the Glenview Road - Waukegan Road intersection should press a button like the one shown here. It will activate the proper signal.

The same system is in use at the pedestrian crossing on East Lake Avenue near Scott Foresman & Company, and is in regular operation by school children, commuters and SF employees.



After the button has been properly pressed, a pedestrian's signal turns from a red DON'T WALK to a green WALK, as in the photograph above.

WILLIAM MONTNEY, Glenview's Village Sanitarian, conducted a pilot course in April for employees of Hackney's Restaurant on Lake Street. The course instructs food handlers in such important matters as sanitation of equipment and utensils, and personal hygiene. THE GLENVIEW BOARD OF HEALTH will sponsor a Smoking Withdrawal program on the second Tuesday of each month for the next six months.

It begins Thursday, June 11, 8 PM in the Maynard Room of the Glenview Public Library.

The program is being conducted by Arthur Fry, an associate of the Hinsdale Smoking Clinic. It consists of films, lectures, displays, and helpful directions to stop smoking.

The Board of Health hopes that Glenview residents who are concerned about the harmful effects of cigaret smoking will attend at least one of these programs. There is no charge, and students are welcome.

GLENVIEW FIRE CHIEF KENNETH WOOD recommends that you have your furnace thoroughly cleaned this spring -- particularly if you have central air conditioning that makes use of the forced-air blower used in your furnace all winter. Fire Department records show quite a number of fires started because of defective motors in the forced-air blowing system.

A NEW WATER CONTRACT has been executed by Glenview Trustees with the Village of Wilmette. Under its terms, water charges are up from 14¢ per 100 cubic feet to 18¢ per 100 cubic feet.

TWO LONG HIGH-PITCHED BLASTS on the Glenview siren signify a tornado warning, which means a tornado has actually been spotted in our area. When you hear the blasts: 1) GO TO THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF YOUR BASEMENT (yes, the corner towards the tornado). If your house has no basement, take cover under heavy furniture at the center of the house. Leave some windows open, but stay away from them. 2) KEEP TUNED TO A RADIO for latest reports. All stations will carry bulletins. More detailed instructions will appear in your July Newsletter.

SINCE YOUR LAST REPORT, GLENVIEW TRUSTEES . . .

* Received replies to the Senior Citizen Housing Questionnaire indicating that 50 individuals and 8 couples meet the tests of age, residence and income limits to qualify as residents of a Cook County Housing Authority senior citizens building project in Glenview.

* The cooperation agreement from the Cook County Housing Authority re senior citizen housing has been referred to Village Attorney Zachary Ford for his opinion.

* Denied rezoning for the Bengston property on Pleasant Lane, just east of Waukegan Road. Owners had sought rezoning to allow for construction of multiple-family dwellings.

* Decided not to provide a grade crossing at Linneman Street.

* Accepted the Plan Commission's recommendation re the Richard C. Hanson Subdivision, clearing the way for a four-story office building at the southwest corner of Waukegan Road and Lake Avenue.

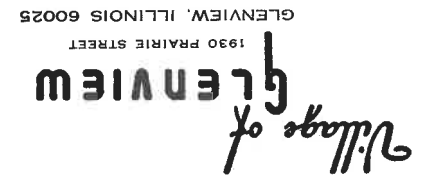
LET'S ELIMINATE LITTER!
