THE BUILDING DEPARTMENT reports some confusion as to installation of central air conditioning condenser units and systems. Glenview residents should take note of these facts:

It is the responsibility of whoever installs the equipment to obtain a permit for electrical work. A plot plan, showing the location of the condenser unit on the property, must be submitted. (Condenser units must not be placed in any front or required side yard, according to Village ordinance.)

Please check with the Building Department for specific information about front and side yard requirements for your property, before deciding upon condenser unit placement.

WERE YOU COUNTED? If you were a Glenview resident on April 1 of this year and were not counted in the 1970 Census, please mail your name and address, marked "CENSUS," to the Village Hall. (If you mailed in the census questionnaire or were interviewed by an enumerator, then you were included.) Glenview's share of Illinois Motor Fuel Tax money and Income Tax, money is based on population, so counting everyone is very important.

ECOLOGY NOTE: Glenview residents who are interested in helping to recycle wastes can donate glass to the River Trail Nature Center, at 3120 North Milwaukee Avenue, just north of Lake Avenue.

As you know, Glenview now has a No Burning Law, applying to leaves and yard debris as well as to everything else. This is vitally necessary to a clean environment.

Your waste disposal contractor will take all bagged leaves and yard debris now, and up to four bags per stop during the peak period. The Village is helping too during the peak period, collecting all bagged residue east of Waukegan Road on Mondays, and west of it on Tuesdays.

Please place bags at curbside on regular collection days for the waste disposal contractors. You are urged to use bags, rather than other kinds of containers, and please tie the bags securely. This will speed the loading process and help assure efficiency during this critical period. (The bag method also leaves your parkway clear after collection, with no unsightly cans or containers to mar the neighborhood's appearance.)

SPECIAL PLEA TO PARENTS: Please educate your children as to the importance and seriousness of the leaf problem, and explain to them that the breaking of plastic bags full of leaves is not appreciated by either the householder who has collected them or the Village authorities who have spent much time and money this season to make our clean environment program work.
