THREE FIREMEN JOIN GLENVIEW DEPARTMENT



HOWARD CLARK (left) and JIM GIRDLEY (center) of Des Plaines, and JOHN PITTENGER (right) of Lake Zurich are new to the Glenview Fire Department. They began their service with us on November 16, embarking upon the Department's three-week (168-hour) intensive training program.

When they go onto regular shift duty December 7, they bring each of the three shifts up to a complement of five men. Total strength of the Department will then be 17, including Chief KENNETH WOOD and Fire Inspector PHILIP GUZZETTA.

HAVING A NATURAL TREE FOR THE HOLIDAYS?

Buy a fresh one. If no needles fall when you bounce it hard on its trunk, it's probably fresh. Keep it outdoors with the trunk in a pail of water until ready to decorate. When you bring it in, put it in a safe spot: away from all sources of heat, away from TV sets, and not blocking exits or stairwells. Use only lights with Underwriters Laboratories seals.

ARTIFICIAL TREES are fine, but if they contain any metal parts, do not string them with lights. Use floodlights only, placed well away from them. Whether the tree is natural or artificial, turn off any lights involved when no one is at home to watch the tree.

OUTDOOR LIGHTING should be done only with equipment labeled for exterior use. It's extremely dangerous to use interior lights out of doors.

SINCE YOUR LAST REPORT
Glenview Village Trustees . . .

● Directed the Village Attorney to petition the Circuit Court of Cook County for an annexation referendum for Willows and Willows West Subdivisions (north of Lake Avenue on both sides of Pfingsten), the Signode property, Glenbrook South High School, and industrial areas on the north side of West Lake between Signode and the Glenview Naval Air Station and east of Willows Subdivision north of the Air Station.

(NOTE: Such an annexation would be contingent upon simultaneous action by the Air Station. The referendum would probably be held early in 1971. If it were to carry, Glenview Village limits would extend west to Landwehr.)

● Referred the matter of banning sales of detergents containing phosphates to the Glenview Board of Health for a recommendation.

● Received a petition for annexation from King's Lane, 15 property owners west of Wagner Road and south of Winnetka Avenue.

● Received a request from Glenayre Property Owners' Association to oppose expansion of the Old Orchard Road interchange, and arranged a meeting with Cook County Highway officials to make our opposition known.

● Amended the Zoning Map to change the Kraftco property at 41-114 Waukegan Road from multiple-family to I-1 (limited commercial use), to permit construction of the company's international headquarters.

● Amended the Building Code to allow, in Zones I-1 and I-2 (light manufacturing), a new maximum height of 70 feet, provided such height is erected at least 400 feet from the nearest property line.

A PUBLIC HEARING has been set for 8 PM on Monday, December 14, in the Maynard Room of the Glenview Public Library, to allow the Glenview Disposal Company to show cause why it should be relicensed for 1971.

The company serves 35% of the single-family residences in Glenview, and the Village Manager has received a disproportionate number of complaints from the residents served, concerning the service.

IF YOU LIVE ON A STREET WITH NO CURBS, now is the time to put out markers to prevent snow plow damage. Street edge reflectors are available at hardware counters, or broom handles with the tops painted red (or wrapped with reflective tape) can serve to protect the edge of your lawn from the blade of the plow.

Please do not use heavy, hard objects such as logs or stones to mark the edge of the pavement. These things are quickly covered by falling snow and cannot serve as a warning. Besides, they are distinct hazards, as if they should be struck by the plow they can break the blade and severely injure the driver.

Effective markers should be high enough and distinct enough for the snow plow driver to see at night while snow is falling heavily.
